(Continued.) It was good to be playing down the road, so we continued our walk and, cutting across some fields, made our way back from the direction of Hoogstraaf. By this time the sun had long set and fleecy clouds streaked the pink horizon against which stood out as of old the graceful spire of Poperinghe. We passed the wood where the nightingales used to sing so sweetly as I went that way. Then, crossing the railway track, we re-entered the streets of Poperinghe, no longer dark but lit now with electric lights. On our ear, once again came the sounds of music and merry-making. Throngs of people passed along the winding streets, and the cobblestones made walking difficult. Before retiring for the night we had a long talk with our host and hostess and were shown photographs of Canadian officers who had been billeted in the house during the war. We felt completely at home among people who cherished grateful memories of our troops. When I got to my room I looked out of the window and saw before me, towering into the starlit sky, the spire of the old church. It was long before I got to sleep, for, in spite of the sounds of merrymaking that filled the town till the early hours of the morning, I felt the haunting presence of great ghostly armies and fell asleep trying to realize that I was in Poperinghe once more.

CHAPTER 2. The morning broke cloudy and misty. I got up and looked out of my window into the street. The day life in Poperinghe was beginning and it began with the service in the church where there was a great reunion of families. I saw the people coming up the street and then passing into the door at the foot of the tower. It was interesting to watch them. Old men and old women, young men and little children would gather in groups and give the day's salutations. The town gossip was passed from one to another and then the groups would disperse and enter the building.
