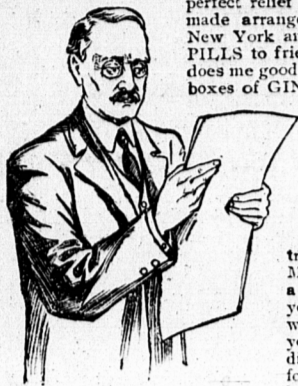

AUSTRALIA'S FIRST DREADNOUGHT

The opening of a new era in the history of Empire defence was ushered in on Wednesday when the first Overseas-owned Dreadnought cruiser was launched. This notable vessel, which will be the flagship of the first unit of the Commonwealth fleet, is the Australia, which was successfully sent down the slipway at the yard of Messrs. John Brown and Co., Clydebank. Lady Reid, the wife of the High Commissioner in London for the Commonwealth of Australia, performed the naming ceremony. Sir George Reid and a large number of representative Australians were present, and afterwards attended a luncheon.

In responding to the toast of the success of the cruiser, prosperity to the Commonwealth, and the health of Lady Reid, proposed by Lord Aberconway, who presided, Sir George Reid said that there might be some dry rot setting in some parts of the British Isles, but there was no dry rot about the Clyde, Australia, he continued, stood in a novel position today. The vast continent lay thousands of miles away from the storm centres of the naval and military forces of the world. Within her borders she had no hostile neighbours and no racial discord. She was absolutely removed from the necessity of universal military service or an Australian fleet. Then why this fleet—this universal service? Because Australia was not an unnatural child. She recognized to the full her obligations as a member of the British Empire.

The fact that the ship will be called after the Commonwealth itself gives an indication of what it represents to Overseas Britain. It is not, however, the first vessel of the name to leave the Scottish river, a belted cruiser called the Australia having been launched some thirty years ago. At that time the cruiser's name was regarded as a compliment to the Dominion; but on this occasion it may be said that in building this magnificent warship in a Clyde yard the Commonwealth has, as it were, returned the compliment.

The Australia is built on the same lines as the Indefatigable, and is, in fact, practically a duplicate, being in length 555 ft. by 80 ft. beam; she is a draught of 26 ft. 6 in., and will displace about 18,800 tons; her side armour is 8 in. thick. The engines are Parsons turbines, driving four propellers, and as there will be 43,000 shaft horse-power it is expected that the vessel will exceed her designed speed of 25 knots. Her main armament consists of eight 12 in. guns of fifty calibres in four turrets, two of which are placed so that the guns within can be fired on either beam. The anti-torpedo armament comprises sixteen 4 in. guns. In appearance the vessel is very imposing, and it has been an object of much interest on Clydeside.

The first Australian fleet unit to consist of it will be remembered—three protected cruisers, six torpedo boat destroyers, and three submarines. The total cost of the unit will reach some £4,000,000, every penny of which will be provided by Australia.—Standard of Empire.

Sir—The above is taken from an issue of The Standard of Empire dated 27th October and proves that our fellow citizens in Australia are alive not only to the necessity of protecting their homes, but also their country—the Empire—as they have now a Dreadnought which can take its place with the Imperial Fleet in any part of the globe. Australia has learned that its safety rests only on the supremacy of the Imperial Navy and is playing her part, but what can be said of Canada? She is still talking of what she intends to do, and in the meantime does nothing. Canadians who consider Canada as their home, and the British Empire as their Country are now bowing their heads in shame, but at the same time praying that there is now a man at the helm of Canada, who will direct our steps in the near future so that we in Canada will prove to the world that "The Empire is our country and Canada our home" and that we, along with those in the Mother Country, Australia, New Zealand and South Africa are prepared to strike a blow in defence of any portion of the Empire which may be threatened. Canadians remember that Britain

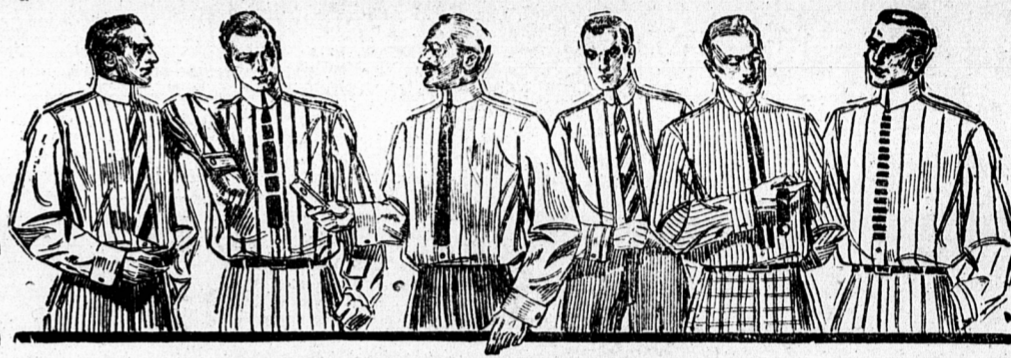
