Miss Annie Maud Magee of Kingston, N. S., and Harry Havelock Morehouse of Kilburn, N. B., were united in marriage on the evening of October 19th, 1912, at the Parsonage of the First Methodist Church, Charlottetown, P. E. I. The ceremony was performed by Rev. J. Heaney, B. A.

The death occurred suddenly and unexpectedly Saturday evening, at the home of his son, J. P. Hood, Charlottetown, of John M. Hood, formerly of Tryon. The late Mr. Hood, although in failing health for some time was apparently as well as usual until Saturday evening taking his nourishment regularly. Shortly before seven his heart failed and he passed peacefully away. He was born in Crapaud seventy-nine years ago and resided for some time at Southport, removing about fifty-five years ago to Tryon where he built up a remunerative boot and shoe business and where also he took a prominent part in everything that in any way pertained to the general good of the community. He was a devoted and active member of the Tryon Methodist Church, a man of sterling character, loved by a wide circle of friends and esteemed by all who knew him. Never of robust health he suffered a stroke of paralysis about a year and a half ago, from which he recovered, but in January last he suffered a second stroke from which, although skillfully and tenderly nursed, he only partially rallied. On August 29th his ailments lost the use of his limbs and fall to the floor of his room, dislocating his hip. Since that time he was almost constantly confined to his bed. The late Mr. Hood, who since his wife and family removed to Calgary on account of the former's ill health, has made his home with his son, J. P. Hood, Charlottetown, from whose home the remains were forwarded yesterday to the residence of George H. Callbeck, Tryon, the funeral taking place today, Monday at 2 p. m. to Tryon Methodist Cemetery. Besides his bereaved widow, who was formerly Miss Annie Leard, daughter of the late John Leard (Creek) three sons, John P., Charlottetown; W. H., Calgary, and Roy in Summerside and one surviving daughter, Mrs. J. W. Callbeck, Summerside, are left to mourn the loss of a kind, devoted and much loved father.

A very pretty wedding took place on Monday evening at eight o'clock at the home of the bride's parents, C. E. and Mrs. Rees of Lancaster St. John, when their daughter, Miss Georgia, was united in marriage with Heath Carmody of P. E. Island. The ceremony was performed by Rev. W. H. Sampson, of St. George's church, Carleton—St John Star.

At Winnipeg in the general hospital on Oct. 4th, Sanctimus E. McKinnon died as the result of an accident on the turn table at Souris, Manitoba. He was known in railway circles as "Big Teen" McKinnon. He was born in Prince Edward Island and worked on the I. C. R. out of Newcastle, N. B., for many years. He went West in 1883 as a locomotive driver, but for the last ten years has had charge of one of the express runs out of Winnipeg on the C. P. R. He was a prominent member of the B. of L. E. and a chief engineer of the local division there for many terms. He is survived by a widow, who was a Miss McCormack, of Winnipeg, but there are several brothers and one sister, the latter lives in Ransano, Alta. one of the brothers is a post-office inspector in Saskatchewan, one is in business in Medicine Hat and two are in California. The late Mr. McKinnon in addition to his connection with the brotherhood was a faithful member of the C. M. B. A. Branch 363.

A sad and much to be regretted accident occurred in this city Friday night whereby Peter Robertson, an old and respected citizen had his hip broken. The accident is all the more regrettable from the fact that there was no excuse for it whatever, Mr. Robertson being the victim of a reckless driver who after running into him and knocking him down did not even stop to find out to what extent the old gentleman was injured. Mr. Robertson who is 89 years of age was on his way home from attending evening service at St. Augustin's Cathedral. He was at Crabbe's corner and was just stepping off the curb on the crossing when a horse and carriage coming up Grafton Street swept around the corner at a high rate of speed, cutting in at the curb as close as possible, knocking the old gentleman off his feet as stated, the driver continuing out Great George Street without stopping. Several people who witnessed the accident ran to the assistance. He was picked up and driven to his home on Kent Street East, where upon medical aid being summoned it was ascertained that his hip was broken. He was at once removed to the city hospital, where he is receiving every care and is doing as well as can be expected.

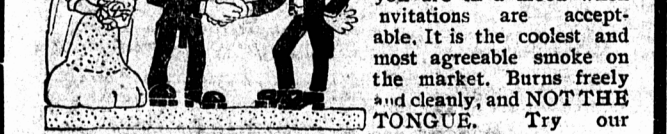
