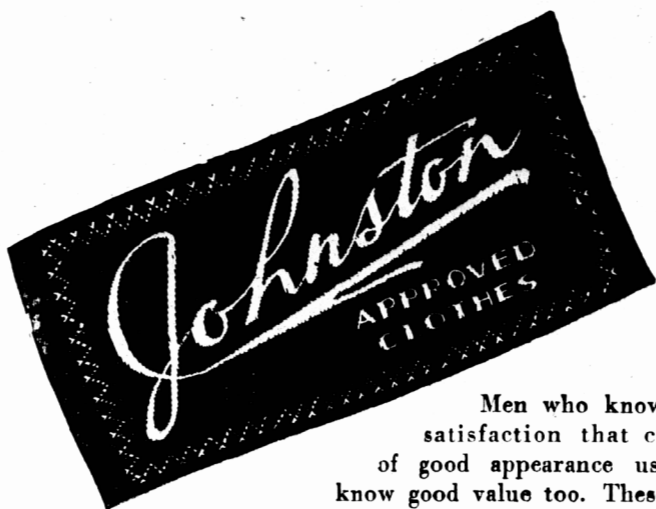

Early Survey Indicates TV Hits Movies

Will television cut down the attendance at local movie houses? Hot controversy has been raging around that question in the United States since TV began its post-war mushroom development south of the border.

television sets. Fifty-nine per cent of the families canvassed reported they now attend fewer movies than before buying their sets.

Hardest hit by TV-gazing is radio, with listening hours dropping 26 per cent for daytime and 58 per cent for nighttime. Total participation in all entertainment outside the home declined 24 per cent.

While television is thus seen as a magnet which keeps the family group more at home, concentration on the screen precludes the usual home activities — the survey disclosed a drop of 18 per cent in the amount of reading done.
