CANADA'S FORCE
LESS THAN IN MAY.

OTTAWA, Nov. 25.—Canadian casualties since the first of June last have totalled 42,000 or a little over twice the total of casualties from the time the Canadians first got into the trenches until the end of last May. In June there were 11,797 Canadian casualties; reported in July 3,684 in August 3,079 in September 9,051 and in October 14,321. The casualties this month have been so far decidedly lighter than in September or October but will still average several score per day.

WONDER SHIP IN ITALIAN NAVY
The Tuff' All Travelled at Speed Three Times Faster Than Liner.

ROME, Nov. 21.—"Tuff' All" is the name of Italy's youngest battleship. The name means "All Wings," and it is not badly chosen, for this ship dashes through the ocean at the rate of the fastest train that speeds across America. The inventors are in the Italian navy, and she was built in Italian shipyards with Italian machinery and of Italian steel. The inventors' names, the ship's tonnage, its present whereabouts, are all in deep secret. But the fact remains that "All Wings" in her trial trip did 800 miles at three times the rate of the fastest transatlantic ship.

The Land Dreadnoughts

Those "Dreadnoughts" on land, which Thomas Attkin has ignobly labelled "Tanks," have now come into poetic prominence, and the following prize poem has been published in the Westminster Gazette:

THE TANK.

(With Apologies.)
Wot makes ole Fritz's 'eart to jump, wot makes 'is feet to freeze?
Wot makes 'im wonder, wot on earth'll be our newest weeze?
It isn't our machine guns, nor it our certain fire,
But it's just our dear ole Creme de Menthe wot makes 'em to perspire.

As neither coal nor naphtha could be stored in large enough quantities to enable Tuff' All to travel at such a rate, the inventors had recourse to a combination of naphtha and compressed air. The naphtha passes through compressed air at such a terrific rate that it emerges in a state of pulverization; it is then propelled into so-called boilers by means of atmospheric pressure, thus producing heat of from 1,500 to 1,800 degrees centigrade. Tuff' All has three turbines which propel with a force of 8,400 h.p. each.

Terrific Speed.
The result is the terrific speed attained and the general effect of a phantom ship. The safety valves throw off showers of water and pulverized iron, which turn bright purple in the sun as they fly upward. The ship shakes as though it were in a perpetual earthquake. Even hardened seamen have to learn to walk on Tuff' All. The steel lining would break with the vibration but for a special system of pneumatic rollers of the bilges is so great that nobody's voice can be heard. All orders are given by signal as in the midst of leaves a high mountain of sea behind her.
