strengthening and infilling? Possibly there is no more needed lesson and no greater lesson for the Christian man to learn than the value and the necessity of retirement from the scenes of service and of public activities for communion with God—for the replenishing which can come in no other way than through protracted quiet in meditation and prayer.

And prayer clarifies the vision. Like love, it gives to the faculties "a double power above their functions and their offices." After many hours of uninterrupted fellowship with His Father it does not surprise us to learn that the eyes of Jesus were quick to see His disciples in their peril—tolling in rowing—and that He was forthwith equal to their rescue.

There is no need to get tangled up in useless controversy over the question of miracles in the study of these lessons. Where Jesus Christ is Master everything is plain. The miraculous of fifty years ago is the common thing of the common day at the present time.

Some moral insensibility, however, put the intellects and the emotions of the disciples into kinks of fear and sore amazement. "They understood not concerning the loaves, but their heart was hardened." It is when we walk in the light as He is in the light that fellowship follows which casts out fear.

When the sea was crossed Jesus was again thronged by the multitude, the pitiful, smitten, diseased, pained people sought His healing touch. What happened? "As many as touched Him were made perfectly whole." The application is at hand: "His touch has not lost its ancient power." Be sure, however, to test it for faith-living. Faith-healing may then turn out to be of much less importance.
