Steels Lead Down Trend In New York

(By Frederick Gardner) (Associated Press Financial Writer) NEW YORK, May 22--Dribbling declines throughout most of the week were further stressed in Saturday's brief stock market session when leading issues stepped down fractions to more than 2 points. Steels led the day's downturn, with other industrial groups following. Utilities, up for a time, ended slightly under water. Ralls held declines to fractions. The Associated Press average of 60 issues was off 1/2 of a point at 38.9, making the net drop for the week 1.7 points. Volume amounted to 386,070 shares. Among the Canadian issues, Hiram Walker moved ahead about a half point, while minor fractional improvements were registered by McIntyre and Lake Shore. Canadian Pacific was down slightly. Canada 4s were inactive. Canadian funds were off 5-32 of a cent. Prominent in the day's losing division were U. S. Steel at 43 3-4, Bethlehem 44 1-2, Chrysler 41 3-8, General Motors 28 3-4 and U. S. Rubber 26.

Stock Prices Edge Lower In Montreal

(C.P. By Guardian's Special Wire) MONTREAL, May 22--Listings on the stock exchange edged lower again on Saturday, continuing general decline of the previous few days. Ralls were generally lower. But Canadian Car and Foundry preferred advanced 1-2 at 27 1-2. The common stock dipped 3-8 at 11 3-8 while Canadian Pacific and National Steel Car lost 1-4 each. Construction issues were mostly steady except for Steel of Canada which gave up 3-4 at 64 1-4. Papers were neglected. Total sales: Industrials 10,800; mines 25,000; bonds \$600.

By Guardian's Special Wire) NEW YORK, May 22--Major foreign currencies declined sharply Saturday in foreign exchange dealings in terms of the United States dollar as German and Czechoslovak troops movements created new European tension. Sterling slumped 1 5-8 cents to 84 5-8. The French franc closed at 213 3-4. The Guilders dipped 1/4 of a cent. The Belgas was 1/2 of a cent lower and the Swiss franc declined 1/8 of a cent. The Canadian dollar closed at a discount of 31-32, off 1-4. (C.P. Scarcity of offerings featured dealings as the May close at 1.17 1-4; Jy 104 5-8-4; Oct 86 1-8-8 cents. Canadian export sales were estimated at 100,000 bushels, mostly no. 3 northern and low grade wheats. Cash wheat dealings were practically negligible with spreads firm. Coarse grains moved higher in slow routine dealings, oats closing 1 1-2-1 1-4 higher, barley 1-4 higher to unchanged, flax 1-2-1 7-8 higher, rye 1-3-4 higher. (C.P. By Guardian's Special Wire) TORONTO, May 21--Two of the Toronto exchange indices closed on Saturday at their low points for the month while the base metal index held only a margin of about one point above the low, registered May 2. Net losses were registered all round on Saturday with the golds showing the greatest weakness. Kerr-Addison was sold in heavy volume at a price decline and other medium-price solids were sympathetically depressed. About 87,000 shares of Kerr-Addison changed hands in the two hour session and the price slipped 14 cents. Other medium-price and penny solids showing losses of 10 to 15 cents included MacLeod-Cochran, Little Long Lac, Moneta, Powell-Rouyn, Read-Auther and Teck Hughes. The senior golds held steady in slow action excepting McIntyre which was down 1 1-8 to 40 3-4. All the leading base metals, including Noranda and Hudson Bay were down fractions to a point and Sherritt, Ventures and Pind Orville weakened slightly. Walsby held recorded a recovery, to 2.29 up 10 cents for the day, again trading in substantial volume. Eldorado weakened 7 cents. Losses of 2 to 5 cents were boarded by some of the western oils, including Calgary-Edmonton, Montreal, Home, Okalta, Dalhousie and Pochills. (A.P. 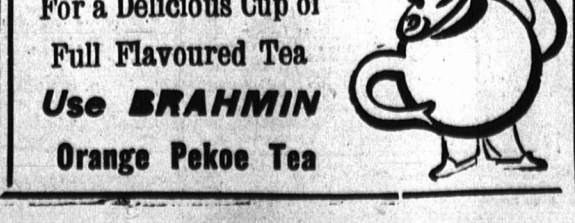
