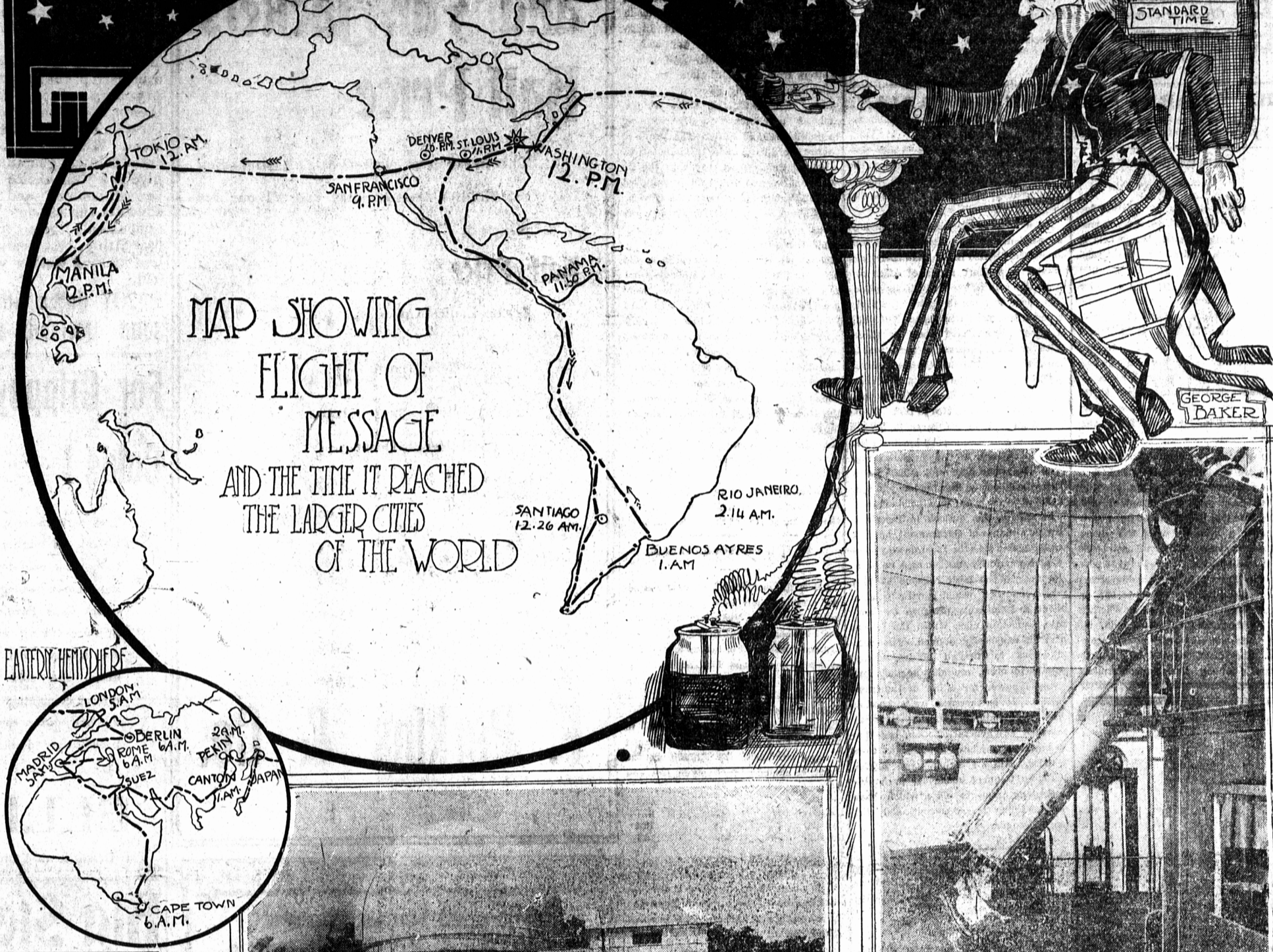

At midnight on the last day of the year the United States government sent a novel, unique and very interesting New Year greeting to the fellow-nations of the globe. This odd vehicle for conveying the compliments of the season was naught else than an electric time signal, which was flashed around the world from the United States Naval Observatory at Washington, formally announcing the birth of a new year at the capital of the republic.

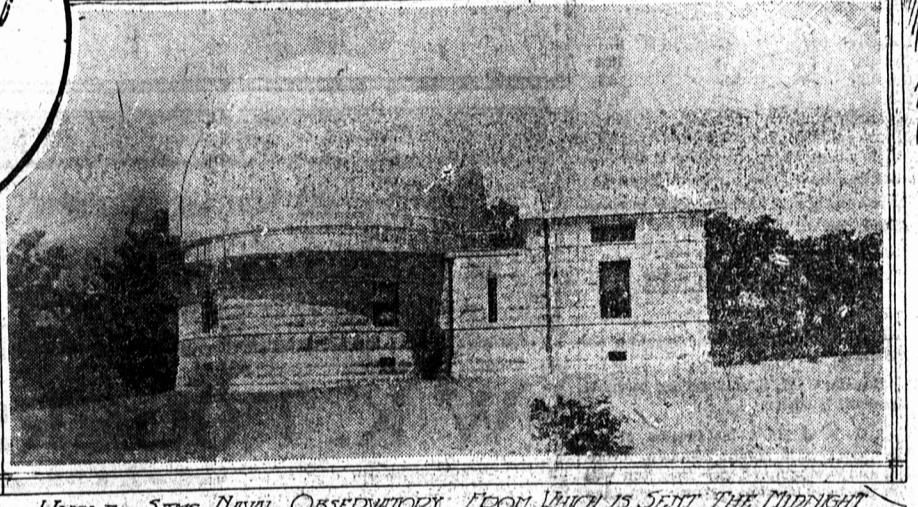
The manner of sending the international New Year greeting, and the method followed to insure its absolute accuracy, are the same employed in timing and transmitting the daily time signal sent broadcast over our country each day at noon. This noon signal has, in a sense, quite a different purpose from the New Year announcement. The latter is prompted solely by sentimental reasons. The former is one of the requirements of modern business. There are many clocks in the United States—some 70,000 of them

and the owners of which are anxious to have them register absolutely correct time, something that can, of course, be insured only by frequent regulations. Three or four minutes before midnight on the last day of the year all business is suspended on telegraph and cable lines

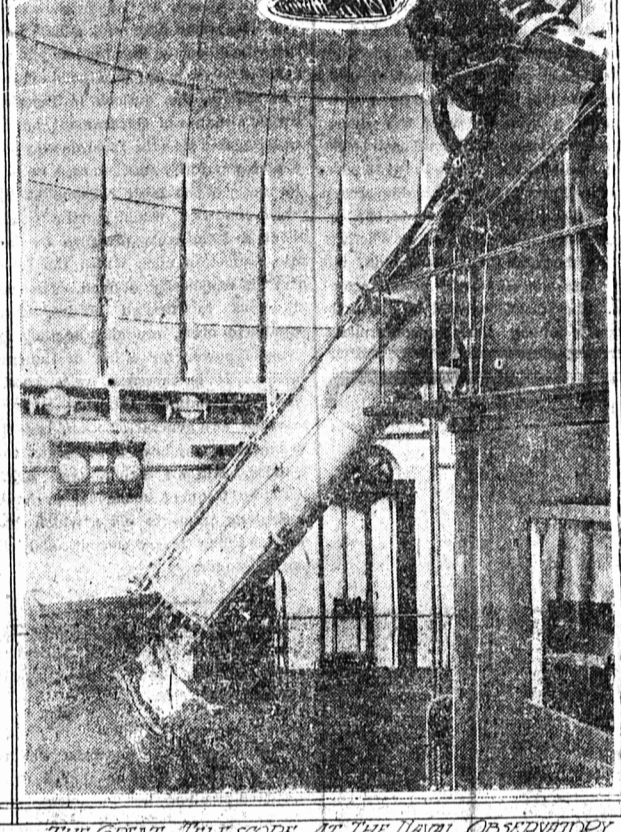
and the transmitting clock at the observatory is brought into the circuit, or, in other words, connected directly with the telegraph wires stretching out over the globe. It has been stated that there are two duplicate transmitting clocks, but only one is used in sending the all-important signal, the other being provided merely for use in case of accident.

As the time approaches for the whirlwind flight of the electric signal the electric current is utilized to tick off the second just as they would be ticked off by a gigantic clock that could be heard around the world. In order to warn telegraph operators and other watchers everywhere of the nearer and nearer approach of the momentous climax there are little admortory pauses in the ticking. A half minute before the New Year signal goes out one second-marking click of the telegraph instruments is skipped. One-quarter minute before the culmination there is another pause, and then finally after the longest of all these periods of silence comes the great throbbing that announces the birth of the New Year.

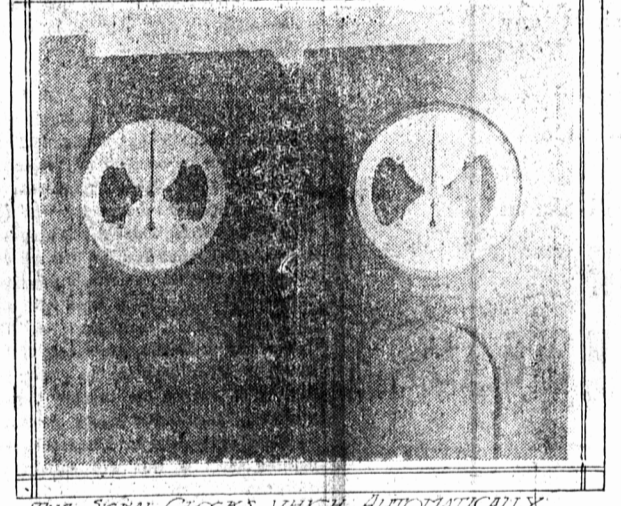
The signal reached some parts of the world at unusual hours, as, for instance, its happening into Rome at 6 o'clock and at London an hour earlier, but at every foreign capital the arrival of the American message was acknowledged by the dropping of a time ball, the dipping of a flag, the booming of a cannon or some other compliment.

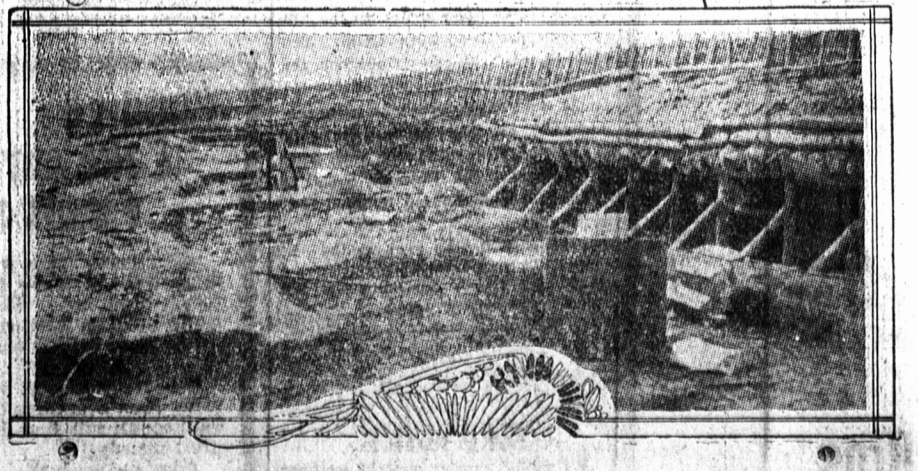
