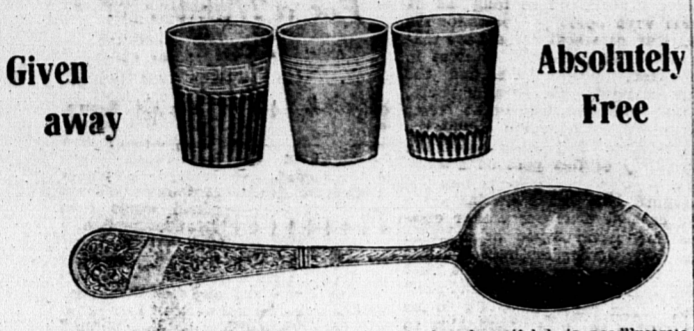

Important Telegraphic News of the week for Saturday Subscribers

GLACE BAY, January 26.—A general meeting of the council was held this afternoon, at which Mayor Douglas refused to preside, claiming that the meeting was illegally called. The council however appointed a chairman and transacted the business for which the meeting had been called. Mayor Douglas, and Henry McDonald were nominated today, as the mayoralty candidates in the town elections, which will be held next Tuesday. There will be contests in all the wards of the town. The civic election campaign which opens tonight, is expected to be one of the most exciting held here in many years.

BOSTON, Jan. 26.—The ash collectors assigned to the Back Bay district of Boston are said tonight to have collected on Tuesday and they also found considerable satisfaction in the fact that Daniel Harvey, the janitor of the apartment house where Mrs. Shriner lives, is an honest man. Harvey today discovered in an ash barrel behind the Shriner apartment jewels belonging to Mrs. Shriner, valued at \$10,000.

Mrs. Shriner lost the gems more than a week ago, and the police of the Back Bay station have been conducting a careful investigation of the theory that the jewelry had been stolen.

Mrs. Shriner, it appears, had concealed her gems in a waste basket which was unexpectedly emptied. When Janitor Harvey heard the words 'waste basket,' he started an investigation of his own, which proved successful.

PARIS, Jan. 27.—The sun is shining in Paris today.

The rain ceased throughout the afflicted districts about noon and at the waters of Seine appeared to subside the lamentations of the populace gave way to rejoicings.

At 12 o'clock the water gauge showed a drop at Point Royal.

The subsidence continued for 3 minutes, amounting to three quarters of an inch.

Cries of joy from the watchers were taken up by thousands along the quays.

Later it was said the fall was due to an overflowing from points where the Seine had broken its barriers.

Experts said the river still was rising this afternoon.

Paris resembles a beleaguered city with a military commander in each of the five sections into which the metropolis is divided.

He holds his soldiers in constant readiness for despatch to points of danger.

The Government has placed the military barracks and public schools at the disposal of the refugees, who already number more than a hundred thousand.

Fifteen thousand laborers are also out of work.

Every minute today brought a new tale of disaster.

ROME, Jan. 27.—The rain, snow and wind storm increased in intensity today.

The river Tiber continues to rise and at noon almost reached the top of the arches of the bridges.

Dead cattle and trees are being borne down the current.

In Naples the damage from the storm increases.

Many of the roads along the sea front are under water and the country is devastated.

The wreckage thrown up by the tide proves that many small boats have been lost.

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 27.—Fifty-one years ago, rather than lose a week's wages and a shot gun, which he had loaned to his employer, Peter Severson took under protest a corner lot in this city, 50 x 100 feet.

Yesterday Severson sold the lot for quarter of a million cash.

OTTAWA, Ont., Jan. 26.—Arthur Wilson, engaged by the British Government to investigate the nickel resources of Canada, addressed the House of Commons today. He stated that Canada possesses three-fifths of the stores of nickel in the world; that a store of nature's wealth is now controlled by an American trust; and that it is the duty of the Canadian Government to step in and take over these nickel deposits for the benefit of the Dominion and the Empire.

COBourg, January 26.—A most brutal murder took place this morning about ten o'clock, near the village of Gratton, seven miles east of Cobourg. It occurred in an Italian camp among a gang working on the construction of the Canadian Northern railway. From details received it appears George Meronto, who was on the inside of the house used by Italians, fired with a Winchester rifle, instantly killing Frank Marino, and seriously injuring two other of his countrymen. Meronto has so far eluded his pursuers. The men had been drinking.

MONTREAL, January 26.—The signing up of Whitcroft and Hay Millar of the Edmonton team by the Renfrew club has brought about the return of Chester Gregory, who has been let out by the millionaires who own the Creamery town hockey team. Chester never got a chance in the game at all, as with Herbie Jordan and Lester Patrick playing the two entire ice positions on the forward line of the Renfrew team there was no chance for Chester to "ring in."

It is not unlikely that Renfrew will also let Jack Fraser go to. He was signed to play the wing, but did not see the goods.
