Close Finishes At Northam Race Meet

Extra Heats Necessary Before Winners Are Declared In Two Classes

Jane Azoff, Squire Hanover, Uscita Britton and Darkey Kalmuck were returned winners in the racing staged at Northam yesterday afternoon. But with the exception of Britton and Hanover, the other winners were forced to go extra heats before the ultimate victor was declared.

Close to 1500 people witnessed a day's racing. Although the times were not exceptionally fast, finishes were generally of the blank variety. There was a minimum of scoring—Starter, Dr. Charles P. Dougan had his fields under full control at all times and with but one exception, the first heat of the Free-for-All Trot, had his fields away on not more than three or four acres. The meet was held up for nearly an hour due to a down-pour of rain just after the third heat of the Free-for-All Pace but with the cooperation of car drivers and "old Sol" the meet was concluded, once the shower had stopped.

FREE-FOR-ALL PACE

1st Heat

Barney Hanover went away at the pole. He held the lead to the three-quarters when Jane Azoff and Aaron L staged their drive. Both horses finished neck and neck in a dead heat with Barney third and San Ton fourth a length behind.

2nd Heat

Jane Azoff went away in front followed by Aaron L and San Ton with Barney Hanover on the outside. Positions remained unchanged as the horses flashed past the judge stand on the first half. Coming into the stretch Jane Azoff and Aaron L staged another thrilling battle with the McNeill & McLean-owned horse winning the heat by a nose. Barney Hanover was third with San Ton fourth.

3rd Heat

Aaron L went away in front. Right up to the three-quarter pole and into the stretch he held the lead but in the last one hundred yards Jane Azoff had just a bit too much brush, sending the race into an extra heat by a neck length.

4th Heat

Indians And Tigers Remain Tied For Lead

NEW YORK, July 31—(AP)—The Tigers remained in a deadlock for the American League lead today by wriggling to a 7-6 11-inning victory at Detroit over New York Yankees and thereby ending a three-game losing streak. Good pitching stopped Joe DiMaggio's hitting streak after he had made at least one safety in 23 consecutive games. Joe Gordon hit his 19th homer of the season with none on in the second inning.

A four-run rally in the eighth inning gave the Indians a 12-11 victory at Cleveland in a slugfest with Boston and kept the Tribe tied with Detroit for first place in the American League. Jimmy Faux, who had been out with a leg injury, returned to the Boston lineup as catcher instead of at first base. Five of the Browns' pitchers tried to stop Washington today but the Senators scored on each of them slugging out an easy 13-5 victory at St. Louis.

NEW YORK, July 31—(AP)—St. Louis Cardinals grabbed both ends of a twin bill at Boston from the B's today 3-1 in 11 innings and 17-8 to sweep the four-game series and creep within a few percentage points of the first division. The double victory gave the Cardinals a record of 17 wins in their last 21 starts and the pair of defeats extended the B's' losing streak to nine straight. Chicago Cubs went down to a costly 7-3 defeat at Philadelphia at the hands of the Phillies as outfielder Angie Galan suffered a fractured left knee crashing against a concrete wall. He probably will be out for the remainder of the season. Johnny Rizzo's 14th home run put Hugh Mulcahy on the road to his 12th victory of the season.

Only one sailing race was held during the day. W. J. Fitzgerald, Georgetown sailed his small yacht to victory, trailed by another Georgetown boat with Paul Fitzgerald at the tiller. Sweeney, drove his Rainey G. Henley three firsts in the free-for-all trot and pace.

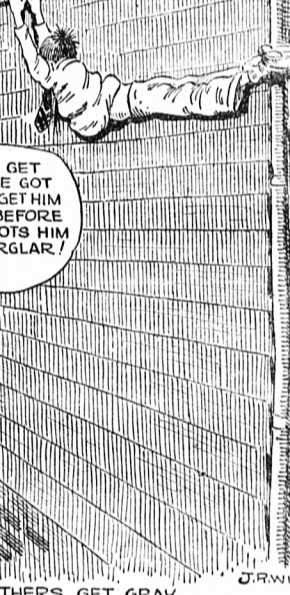

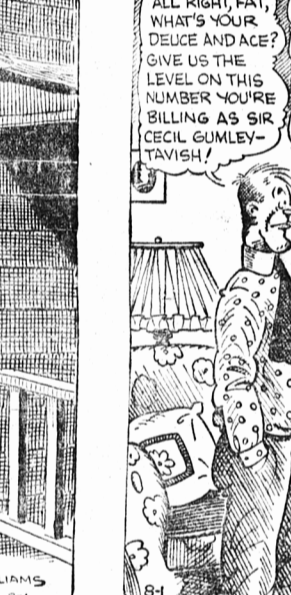

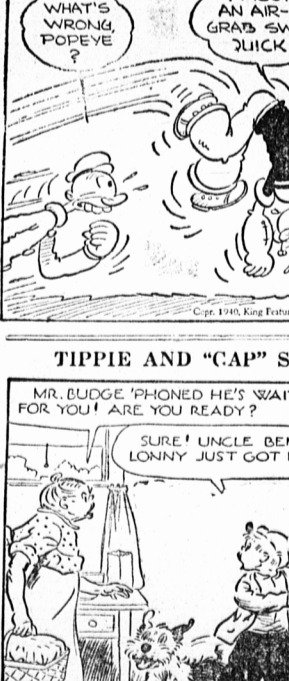
