AFFAIRS OF YORK
COUNTY LOAN CO.

TORONTO, April 17.—It is understood negotiations are proceeding between the National Trust Company, liquidators of the York County Loan and Savings Company, and certain holders of the stock in the Toronto Life Company for a settlement of the claims. These negotiations have not yet been completed, and there is a possibility that they may not be settled. The National Trust Co. on April 6th obtained an interim injunction on the application of liquidators, against several holders of Toronto Life stock, including transferring, assigning or in any way dealing with their shares until a final disposition of the action. The interim injunction is to come up on Wednesday next for argument; in the meantime an arrangement has not been effected. Whatever the result of the negotiations they will not affect the police court proceedings against Joseph Phillips.

GOOD FRIDAY IGNORED.

DEAR SIR.—May I through the columns of your paper call the attention of professing Christians to the absolute indifference shown towards the anniversary of the great drama of Calvary, Good Friday. One's heart aches, to see how little men care, (today in this age of self, of greed, of indifference) for the spiritual things that are awaiting them. Coming here from Nova Scotia, where the day is recognized as holy, where to a very great extent all work, (save that of necessity or mercy) is laid aside, one expected even greater things in this much lauded Island Province. A few weeks ago we read of men gathering in Charlottetown to celebrate the battle of Paardeburg, and men flocked to the house of God to honor the memory of departed comrades who had died for King and country, (and rightly so) and I rejoiced to see divine service announced in the same Church for Good Friday. But where, oh where, are the professed followers of the Crucified Jesus, are they keeping holy the day of His sacrifice, He who died for all? I deeply regret that of all days in the year the Grand Division S. O. T. should choose so sacred a day to hold their annual meeting. Surely what they are building up with one hand, they are demolishing with the other. From a body of temperance workers we clergy expect support, whereas the choice of Good Friday for such a purpose weakens the work of the Church, deprives many, (who would otherwise attend God's House) of the spiritual blessing there obtained, and wars the deep solemnity that should be uppermost in man's heart at this time.

I know men object to having their plans upset, but Christ said: "If any man will come after Me let him deny himself and take up his Cross and follow Me." I seem to hear the voice still speaking to this age—"What! could ye not watch one hour?" I am sure, Sir, I am voicing the feelings of the great majority of Christian leaders today in writing thus. I rejoice that The Guardian was not published on Good Friday, and trust that once the subject is brought before the public, they may determine to keep that (next to Easter) Holy of the Days in a manner becoming followers of our Lord and Christ. NATIVE UNREST IN
CHINESE CONTINUES

LONDON, April 17.—The Tribune's correspondent at Peking telegraphs as follows: "While native unrest continues there is an augmentation of the feelings in the foreign community that the European and American governments are unwise in weakening their positions in the eyes of the Chinese. Major General Vautier (commanding the British troops in North China) and Chief Engineer Blair have proceeded to Wei Hai Wei, ostensibly to disband the Chinese regiments, but really, I have reason to believe, to restore the harbor and port to China. "Even in case of local disturbances the burden of the first defense will fall upon the Americans. The Chinese have a fort on the wall, which secretly commands the American position. This would demand capture by a rush, but afford the necessary men. Meanwhile, incendiary literature is being spread throughout the country."

MAGDALENS

MONTREAL, April 17.—Montreal capitalists have evolved a project that has some picturesque sides to it, and will result in a big change in the fishing trade of the lower St. Lawrence. A syndicate headed by Messrs. Herbert Marier and Arnold Finlay, have formed a company to purchase outright all the Magdalen Islands, and will control all the cod fisheries on the islands and establish large bait industries. In addition, the new company will control the steamship service between the islands and Pictou, for which there is a government subsidy of \$15,000 a year.

The company will have a capital of \$500,000 of bonds, \$1,200,000 of preferred stock, and \$2,000,000 of common stock.
