THE JUDICIAL AND SENATORIAL APPOINTMENTS.

On Wednesday morning last Mr. Borden inquired of Sir Wilfrid Laurier whether or not an appointment had been made to the Judicial Bench of Prince Edward Island to which the Premier replied that the Governor-General was absent, and that on his return, if the question were repeated an answer would be given.

Something had occurred in the meantime. It became pretty definitely known here during the week that Sir Wilfrid had notified Messrs. Warburton and Prowse, the members for Queen's County that he would not consent to have their constituency opened, that he would not act upon their recommendations to appoint Mr. Warburton Judge and Mr. Prowse Senator, and desired them to withdraw their applications and recommend other persons to those positions, and that if they did not do this promptly he would take the matter into his own hands.

Then the wires became hot with messages and several citizens of Charlottetown found urgent business to Ottawa. Throughout Thursday and Friday the telegraph office did a rush business, and new candidates for the Senatorship were put forward in the persons of N. Rattenbury and F. J. Nash, who were backed by sundry personal and political friends in the matter.

On Friday afternoon a message came through from Ottawa that it was quite useless to send further telegrams as the appointments had been settled, and a little later came a definite statement from a high official authority to the effect that H. J. Palmer, K. C., M. L. A., had been appointed Judge. Another message from Ottawa brought the news that B. C. Prowse, ex-Mayor and brother of L. E. Prowse, M. P., had been appointed as Senator.

The tidings spread over the city like wildfire, and were variously received. There was some surprise, even astonishment, and not a little incredulity expressed. Neither of these appointments had been expected. Some disappointed expectants expressed themselves with much emphasis.

THE RECIPROCITY BATTLE AT OTTAWA.

Both the Liberal and Conservative parties have been in caucus recently and some excitement is said to have followed the course decided upon. The Conservative resolve is stated to be that they will fight on to delay or defeat the reciprocity agreement to the bitter end. The Liberals give out that they will consent to no compromise and can stand the endurance test as long as their opponents can.

The Liberal Montreal Herald of the 27th says that the object of the Opposition is to force an election before the redistribution of seats is made, as the Government would stand to gain by the additional representation of the Great West. It adds: "The feeling around the Commons this morning is that should the two parties maintain their present attitude a dissolution and an appeal to the country will take place before next fall." The Herald also intimates that the Opposition fear to await the actual trial of reciprocity before a general election, as they believe it will prove a popular measure. Also that they can more readily

raise a campaign fund to defeat it at the polls now than they could after it had been ratified and gone into effect.

The Toronto News, on the other hand, affirms that the Government is hesitating and marking time, waiting to see what Congress will do, and quite ready to drop the discussion should the agreement fail of ratification at Washington. The Toronto World says that "it is alleged that there are besides the four bolters, several other Liberals who welcome the decision of the Conservatives to fight this thing until the Government either withdraws it or calls a general election to hear the will of the people." The World adds: "E. M. McDonald of Picou and Hon. George P. Graham are amongst the leading Liberals who are reported to be anxiously waiting for something to turn up which will cause the Government to drop the agreement. On a reciprocity ticket they will be defeated."

No doubt in these statements The News and The World are but reflecting what they see through their party spectacles. But it is none the less interesting to note the speculations indulged in upon both sides. This much seems clear that notwithstanding Hon. Mr. Fisher's recent announcement that there will be no election until after redistribution, there is still a conviction on both sides of the House that an election may be forced on before next fall. And that seems to be what the Opposition are playing for. It would also seem probable that a test of endurance is coming, and one Conservative paper ventures to say that "man for man, the Conservatives believe they have the great advantage in endurance."

AS TO HOME RULE.

Among many amendments proposed in the British House of Commons to the Veto Bill was one proposing to restrain the Liberal Government from introducing Home Rule legislation during the present Parliament. This was justified by Mr. Balfour, so far as he could do so, by taking the ground that Home Rule for Ireland was not an issue at the last election, and that so radical a departure should be submitted to a verdict of the people. The amendment was from the first hopeless, but the vote upon it served to accentuate the attitude of both parties in regard to the Irish question. The Liberal Government stands committed to Home Rule and the Conservative Opposition opposed to it.

But there is yet a divergence of opinion in the Liberal ranks as to the manner in which Home Rule shall be brought about, whether as a special concession to Ireland alone, or by the process of federalising the Kingdom and giving local legislatures to England, Scotland, Ireland and Wales. Ireland is disposed to insist upon priority in this matter in view of her long struggle to achieve her legislative independence, while a strong feeling exists in Scotland and

Wales that they are entitled to equal consideration. The larger measure would apparently be more acceptable to the majority in Great Britain than would the concession of Home Rule to Ireland alone, and this divergence of opinion may prove an obstacle and a cause of delay in the final settlement of the question.

It would be rash to predict what the final outcome may be. At present Home Rule for Ireland, and for Ireland alone, holds the foremost place on the Government's program after the passage of the Veto Bill, and the latter holds the combined support of the Liberal and Irish members mainly as a preparatory measure to the passage of Home Rule. In Gladstone's time the obstacles to Home Rule were found to be insuperable. The Conservatives are not without hope that something may yet occur to again defeat it. Three times in succession the Liberal, Irish and Labor combination has indeed proved victorious at the polls, but it has been rarely that any Administration has survived a fourth successive appeal to the people. Hence the great apparent desire of the Opposition for another appeal to the people before the great constitutional changes that are now pending shall be carried into effect.
