Presbyterians Score Re Temere Decree. General Assembly Passes Resolution on the Matter. Giving to Church Schemes Not Enough, Reports Committee.

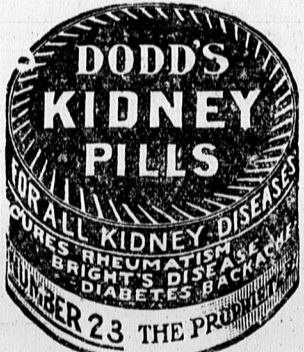
OTTAWA, June 14—A strong pronouncement against the promulgation of the Ne Temere decree and a warning to the people of the church to abstain from mixed marriages till the situation is cleared up, was passed by the Presbyterian general assembly here tonight.

"But so long as the Ne Temere decree is attempted to be enforced in Canada, while deeply regretting the necessity of suffering any cloud to rest upon the social harmony that should exist among all Christians in this dominion, the general assembly is compelled to warn all our people to abstain from entering into the marriage tie with those who give their allegiance to the Church of Rome."

CHURCH UNION BALLOTING.

At the Presbyterian assembly today, the question of church union came up again. The standing committee of which Principal Patrick is chairman, reported, incorporating the recommendations of the special committee which the assembly had already accepted, and also making an additional recommendation that in addition to the vote from church sessions, members and adherents, a vote be also asked from the presbyteries. This was agreed to.

authorized to take what steps it deemed best to lay the proposed basis of union before the church members. It is possible that printed copies of the proposed basis may be sent to every member so that an intelligent vote may be taken. In addition to the vote on the submitted question form, the members and presbyteries will be asked to make suggestions.

It is possible that legislation to effect the separation of Queen's University from the church will be secured in August, though Rev. Dr. Herridge, and some others think it will take a year. Principal Gordon announced that two charters would be secured, a provincial and a federal. Rev. J. H. Edmondson said he understood there would be two incorporations, one for the university and one for the theological college.

CONTRIBUTIONS TOO SMALL.

That self indulgence and the desire to make money have caused a disappointing condition in church finances one of the many statements made at the assembly in the report of the committee on systematic church giving, read in part:

It is rather disappointing that the books of the church treasure do not show a larger increase. In some synods there has been a positive decrease and in no synod has there been an increase corresponding to the membership and growth of wealth. "Apart from the legacies and special gifts the total increase from the congregations over the whole church is only \$23,686.

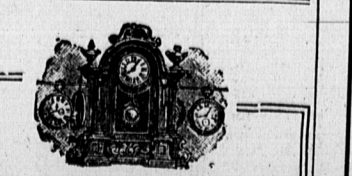
PEOPLE SPEND TOO MUCH.

"But there are other reasons not so creditable to our people. Rich and poor alike are more lavish and self-indulgent than ever before, and notwithstanding abounding prosperity and ever increasing numbers, they spend all they receive and are living from hand to mouth."

The report goes on to point out that the average giving for all the church schemes is only about five cents per communicant, or ten cents per family each week.

On the suggestion of Principal Forrest, of Halifax, copies of the resolution on arbitration, passed with such enthusiasm on Tuesday, will be sent to Earl Grey and to President Taft.

The assembly approved of the report of the special committee appointed to deal with the payment of commissioners' traveling expenses to the general assembly. The plan proposed is based on the estimate of expense for ten years, allowing two assemblies in the far east two in the far west and six in the centre.

CROWD WATCHES BOLD BOLD-UP IN NEW YORK

NEW YORK, June 14—In the presence of more than 300 persons, who looked on while the robbery took place, five unidentified men held up and robbed Charles Finkelstein, aged sixty-five years, a real estate dealer, residing at No. 98 Division Street, on the platform of the Second Avenue elevated station at Fifty-Seventh Street, yesterday afternoon.

When Mr. Finkelstein boarded the train on his way downtown, he was compelled to stand on the platform on account of the car being crowded. He noticed five men standing close to him, and every time the car jolted he was jammed in between them. He suspected something was wrong and put his hand in the pocket that held his wallet.

"One of the men had the nerve to try to pull my hand out of my pocket so his companion could get my purse," said Mr. Finkelstein. "I tried to get away from them, but they formed a circle and made me remain with them until Fifty-seventh Street Station was reached."

As the train came to a stop the men shoved Mr. Finkelstein off and knocked him down on the platform. Then they ransacked his pocket, taking his purse, containing \$20 in bills, a diamond ring worth \$250, a diamond locket and nine dollars to real estate owned by the victim.

"Help, help, they're robbing me!" cried Mr. Finkelstein, as he lay prostrate on the platform. Every person on the platform heard his call for assistance, but no one went near him, although he held fast to the man that had knocked him down.

Two of the robbers stood off a few feet with their hands on their hip pockets. "We'll shoot the first man that comes up," they said. The crowd remained terrified, and when the train pulled out three of the robbers jumped on the train and escaped, while their two companions dashed down the steps and disappeared.

WESTMINSTER CONFESSION NOT TO BE TAKEN LITERALLY

TORONTO, June 14—The Globe published a story this morning to the effect that the graduating class at Knox College refused to subscribe to the Westminster Confession of Faith. Rev. Mr. Cockburn, librarian at the college, in an interview this morning said:

"That is a misrepresentation of the students' attitude. 'I do not see why such a story should have appeared in any paper,' said Rev. Mr. Strachan, pastor of the Rosedale Presbyterian Church. 'There was no reason at all for putting it in. The Westminster Confession is three or four hundred years old and you must not forget that it was a document of protest, a reform document.'"

"The Presbyterian Church adhere to it as an historic document on the grounds of broad general principles. You may take any document of that time, and under those conditions and make ducks and drakes of it today. These young men simply did not understand the confession and its use about it. It was explained to them and that was all there was to it."
