Livestock

MONTREAL, Dec. 23—(CP)—The Dominion livestock branch reported today that prices were steady to firm from all grades of livestock on the two Montreal markets. The small number of cattle were made up of a few low medium and common steers and the balance cows. Cows were about steady. Steers a shade firmer and the best steers sold up to \$7.50. Common were \$5.50 to \$6.75. Heifers sold from \$4.50 to \$7. Good cows were \$5.50 to \$6. Medium \$4.50 to \$5.25 and common \$4 to \$4.50. Canners and cutters were \$2.75 to \$3.75. Bulls ranged from \$3.75 to \$5.75. Veal calves were steady. Grassers were stronger. There were no top veals. Good veals made \$11.50 with medium kinds selling up to \$11 and common light veals from \$8 to \$10. Drinkers were \$5.50 to \$8.50 and grassers were \$4.50 to \$5, mostly \$4.75 to \$5, common light kinds were not wanted. Lambs were steady. When graded, good ewes and wethers were \$10 with culls and bucks picked out at \$8. The bulk of lambs were sold on a flat basis at \$1. Sheep were \$3 to \$5.50, mostly \$4.50 to \$5. Hogs were firm at time of writing there were no early sales.

NEW YORK, Dec. 23—(AP)—The Shanghai and Canadian dollars declined in relation to the United States dollar today in the free foreign money market. The Far Eastern currency lost 26 of a cent at 5.57 cents, lowest level in weeks. The Canadian unit dipped 3-16 to 89 9-16 cents. (Ottawa Foreign Exchange Control Board rate 9.00-9.21 pre cent discount). Other chief rates, including the pound sterling at 4.04, were unchanged.

CHICAGO, Dec. 23—(AP)—After sagging almost a cent in early dealing, wheat prices rallied today and pushed upward for small net gains. Wheat closed 1-8-3-8 higher than Saturday, May 84 3-8-1-2, July 79 6-4, corn unchanged to 1-8 up, May 60 1-4, July 60 1-8, oats unchanged.

WINNIPEG, Dec. 23—(CP)—Light offerings and scattered buying combined to hold wheat futures prices steady today on the Winnipeg grain exchange. At the close values were 1-8 higher to unchanged with Dec 72 7-8, May 76 3-8 and July 78 cents. Little change was reported at Buenos Aires while values ranged from 1-8 cent lower to unchanged at noon.

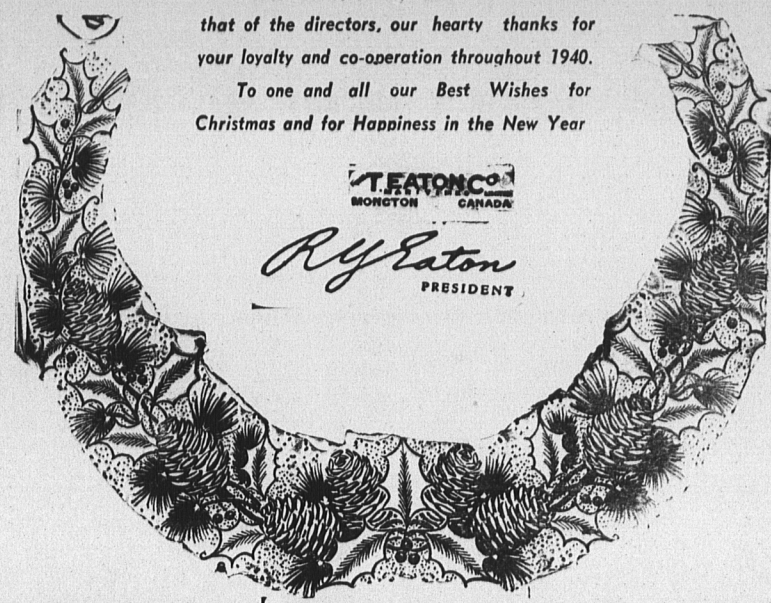

FALLING OFF IN LAWYERS

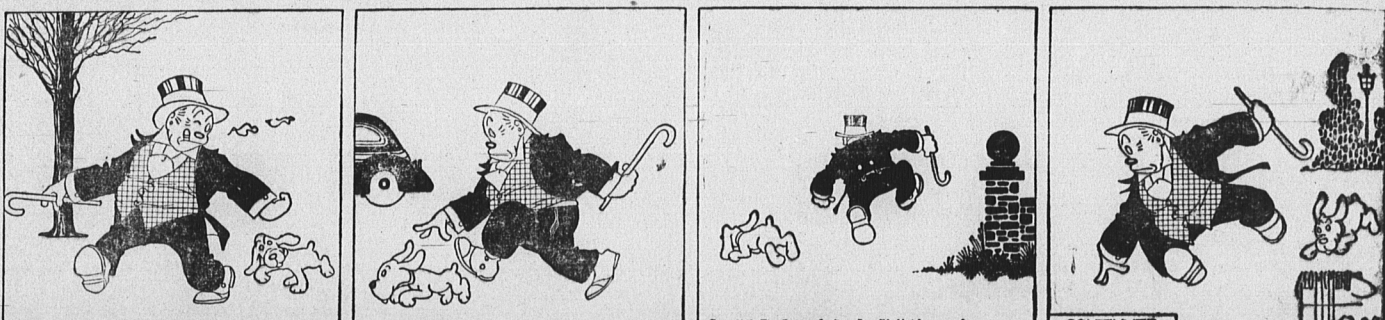
LONDON—(CP)—Fewer than 50 barristers were called in London this term, a record low because of the war. One woman donned wig and gown in the abbreviated ceremonial.

BOMBED BUT SHOWFUL

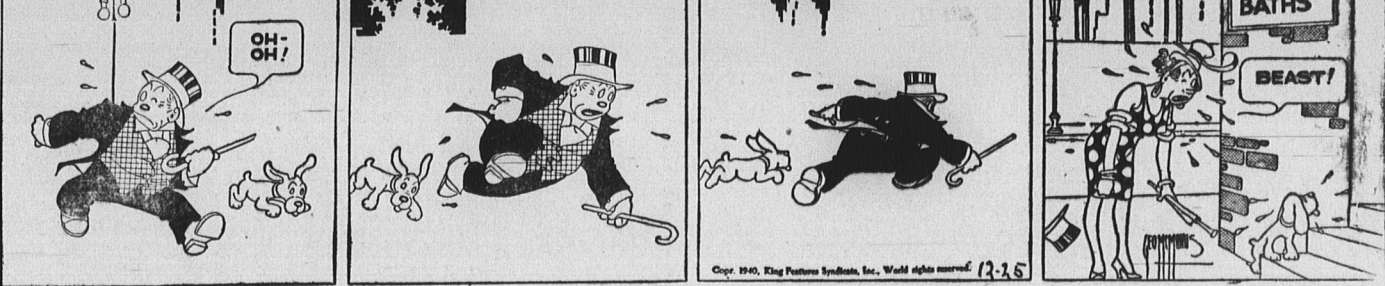
