GAYNOR FIGHT WILL PERHAPS RUN YEARS

The Fugitives Plan to Begin the Struggle All Over Again to Resist Extradition. They are not Going Back to the U. S. They Say But Shall Win in Canada.

QUEBEC, Feb. 16. John F. Gaynor and Benjamin D. Greene, who came to this city three years ago, forfeiting ball bonds to the amount of \$80,000 rather than stand trial before United States District Judge Emory Spear upon indictments found against them in connection with the Savannah harbor frauds, are likely to continue residents of Quebec three years longer if they care to remain.

While disappointed at the adverse decision of the British privy council in the appeal taken by the government from the decision of Judge Caron of Quebec, in their favor, they are preparing to begin their fight all over again and are confident that they will win.

Before the case is finally decided it promises to become one of the most celebrated in the history of extradition proceedings, involving as it does, notable points of law and powerful social and political influences both in Canada and the United States.

Colonel Gaynor, who has gained in weight during his residence in Canada, consented to discuss some aspects of his case.

"We are not going back to the United States," he said. "We shall beat them here. As I told you three years ago we have always been willing to go back if we could be assured of a free trial, but when we found that we would be forced to stand trial in Savannah, where the case was prejudiced against us, there was nothing left for us to do but to come here."

"Have you ever been back to the United States since you came here?" was asked. "I shall not answer that question," Colonel Gaynor said, smiling. "But this talk that Quebec is full of secret service men is all nonsense. There is not one here. We are free to come and go anywhere we like, but we are well enough satisfied where we are. We like it here and we shall stay. As to the legal questions involved in the case, I must refer you to our lawyer, Mr. Taschereau."

Mr. Taschereau, who is a member of one of the leading law firms in the city, discussed some of the interesting legal questions of the case.

"My clients were indicted on a charge of conspiracy to defraud the government," he said. "This is a misdemeanor under the laws of the United States and is not extraditable under the treaties between the United States and Canada. In order to get around this difficulty the United States government came here and asked for extradition on the ground of theft before Judge La Fontaine, extradition commissioner in Montreal. We held that the extradition must be based on the charge in the indictment and not on some other charge. A felony would be extraditable."

"We shall have to await the complete decision of the Privy Council before we can determine its full import, but from
