THE COOK'S CORNER

For Cold Meats
A good sauce can make any meat more interesting, so here are one or two useful hints:

This is a good sauce for cold meats: - Have one teaspoon of salt, two tablespoons of cream or unsweetened milk, one tablespoon of chilli vinegar. Add a little salt and a tablespoon grated horse radish with a teaspoonful brown sugar. Mix all well together and serve separately in a sauce-boat.

Celery Sauce
Have a big white head of celery well washed. Cut into small pieces, boil in either white stock or milk. Season with white pepper, salt, and a pinch of grated nutmeg. Strain the celery when tender. Add a bit of butter, which has been rolled in flour. Add one teaspoonful of cream and never invite to a meal. Serve with either boiled turkey, fowl, or chicken.

Anchor Sauce
Cream four ounces of butter and add two anchovies which have been boned and pounded in a mortar. Add one tablespoon chilli vinegar, mix into the butter, shake very well and serve hot.
