

NOTICE TO HOLDERS

German Government External 7% Loan of 1924 (Dawes Loan) American Tranche, and German Government 5 1/2% International Loan of 1930 (Young Loan) American Tranche

Acting by request of the Minister of Finance, the Bank of Canada hereby gives notice of an undertaking by the German Government with respect to the interest service on the above-mentioned loans.

The German Government has given an undertaking effective November 15, 1936, to provide the Bank of Canada with funds to purchase for the account of the German Government the interest coupons of the above-mentioned loans falling due after November 15, 1936, subject to the following conditions:

- (a) The price of each semi-annual coupon which may be purchased will be the equivalent of twenty dollars lawful money of the United States of America for each thousand dollars of nominal value of the bond, and will be paid in Canadian dollars on the basis of the current rate of exchange on the day each such coupon falls due, and not on a gold basis. (The interest rate in U.S. dollars will therefore be at the rate of 4% per annum.) It is provided, however, that so long as payments at the rate of 2 1/2% semi-annually are made to any United States holder of the interest coupons of the German Government External Loan of 1924 (Dawes Loan) the same price will be paid for such coupons if stamped "Canadian Holder" as hereinafter provided.

Morning Stock Letter

Received Over Pittfield & Co's Private Wire. NEW YORK, Oct. 29.—The Pacific Coast Maritime strike scheduled to take place last night was postponed at least until midnight tonight. The final vote of the Literary Digest shows 1,293,669 for Landon and 972,897 for Roosevelt. In spite of this betting odds still favor Roosevelt. Air Reduction earnings for nine months were \$2.08 against \$1.53. American Tobacco declared the regular quarterly dividend on the common and B stocks yesterday. Dividend meetings today are American Metals, Bethlehem Steel, Container Corporation and Montgomery Ward. We would look for an irregular firm market today and higher prices for the oils especially Standard Oil of New Jersey, Standard Oil of Indiana, also General Motors, Montgomery Ward and U. S. Steel.

MONTREAL, Oct. 29.—Copper production during August increased 23.8 percent over July and 8.7 percent over August 1935. Nickel production during August gained 13.3 percent over same month a year ago, but declined 1.7 percent below July this year. Mineral production during first seven months of 1935—increases shown by Asbestos 51.2 percent; gold 15.9 percent; gypsum 51.0 percent; lead 11.6 percent; lime 6.0 percent; natural gas 10.5 percent; nickel 26.7 percent; silver 14.1 percent and zinc 4.7 percent. Small declines were made by copper, petroleum and commercial salt. C.P.R. gross earnings increased 6.4 percent and net 4.0 percent during September over same month a year ago, nine months gross gained 8.6 percent and net 3.9 percent over same period last year.

MONTREAL, Oct. 29.—Wright Hargreaves fiscal year ending August 31 reported net profit 71.7 cents compared with 69.9 cents last year. Tonnage increase 10.7 percent and recovery 11 percent. Ore reserves increased from 1,244,657 to 1,382,773 tons during the year.

MONTREAL, Oct. 29.—(CP)—Trading dragged on Montreal open produce markets today as butter prices eased slightly. Cheese, eggs and potatoes ruled quiet and steady. Butter was quoted around 24 1-4 cents per pound for carlots or less of No. 1 white lots to retailers were 25 for solids and 25 1-2 for prints. Cheese averaged 12 7-8 to 13 1-8 cents per pound for Ontarios and 12 1-2 to 13 cents for Quebecs. Graded egg shipments in carlots or less were quoted at 45-47 cents a dozen for A-large, 44 to 45 for A-medium, 48 for A-pullets, 26 to 27 for B and 22 1-2 to 23 for C. Potatoes: Que. and N.B. Mts. 80's \$1.10 to \$1.15; Que No. 2 80's 90 to \$1.00; P.E.I. Mts. 90's \$1.30.

TORONTO, Oct. 29.—(CP)—The Toronto mining share market worked up a good deal of enthusiasm in today's trading. Volume was the best in 10 days at 1,211,000 shares. Golds were traded in heavy volume with special attention to Hard Rock, Moneta, Chibougamau, Siscoe and Paymaster. Hard Rock closed 36 cents higher at 3.12, the high for the day, and Chibougamau finished at 1.92, up 17. Siscoe added 25 cents net and Moneta 2.
