therefore, to drink some pints every day between meals. The valuable part of all drinks in general use is not their flavoring, but the water which is their basis. Milk is the ideal combination of food and drink, especially for young children. Fruit drinks, orange, lemon, grape, etc., are pleasant and very healthful; tea freshly made is refreshing.

In order to be of use to the body, the water in these drinks must be easily separated from the other constituents. Some drinks contain so much sugar or other food matter that the water that might be released for its special work in the body continues to be used to dissolve this food. Sugar is useful, so sweet drinks are not harmful, but they are not the best for quenching thirst.

In the case of intoxicants, the matter is much more serious, for alcohol is very greedy for water and quickly absorbs it, and so prevents it from doing its work. It even robs the water from the cells of the body. We have all seen the fat beer drinker, who carries around with him a system loaded up with waste matter. The alcohol has never given the water a chance to eliminate the rubbish properly. Besides withholding the water, the alcohol in strong drink inflames and irritates the linings of the mouth, and stomach in somewhat the same manner as does salt. It will thus be easily seen that beer, wines and spirits are more likely to create thirst than to quench it. In fact it is well known amongst drinkers that one drink, instead of satisfying, usually creates a desire for more.

The very characteristic that makes a good "dryer" of great value to the photographer, makes it worse than useless as a quencher of thirst. —The Australian Temperance Advocate.

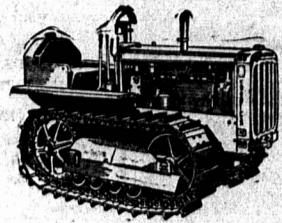

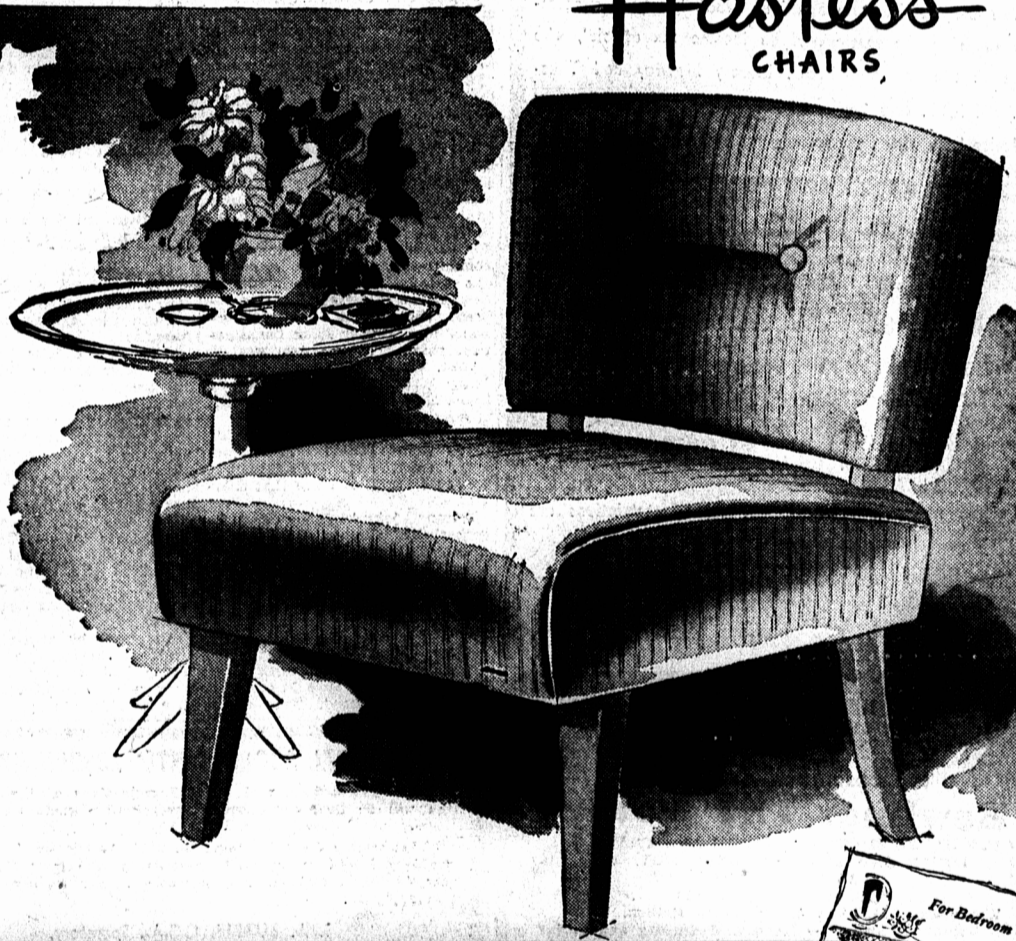

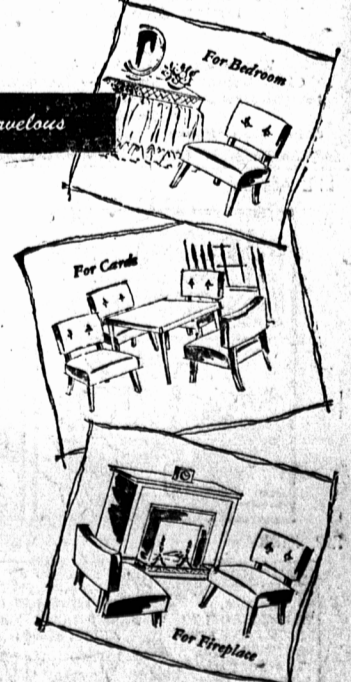
