BUSY TIME AHEAD AT ALL COLLIERIES SYDNEY, Dec. 3.—It certainly looks as if the output of the Dominion Coal Company's Cape Breton coalfields will eclipse all previous records by a very ample margin this year. The tonnage of November's output is stated to be 107,000 and the total for the eleven months of this year is some 4,373,000 tons. The output for the corresponding month of last year was 404,000 tons, and over the same period of last year the total was stated to be 4,147,637 tons. The figures for this year's working shows an increased output by 3,000 tons during the month of November and some 225,261 tons over the eleven months. Even this splendid increase would have been larger but for the fact that an output of some 6,000 tons was lost over Friday and Saturday last, owing to there being no craft available to take prompt delivery of the product. Asked as to the prospects for the winter a prominent official of the company said that barring accidents or breakdowns, the mines should be kept very busy all through the season. They would of course try to bank as much coal as they did last year and would endeavor to beat the record if at all practicable. It was hardly likely that any notable increase could be made on the amount of fuel banked at the utmost limit was just about reached last year, when some 460,000 tons of coal were banked.
