WOULD JAPAN GO TO THE BALTIC?

Ever since the destruction of Rojestvensky's fleet released the Japanese navy from the duty of guarding home waters there has been more or less speculation as to whether Togo would carry the war into Europe.

Russia has three important naval stations on the Baltic. They are Cronstadt, Revel and Libau. Each of these is fortified, the defenses of Cronstadt being especially strong. Several months would

be occupied by the Japanese fleet in preparing for and in completing the voyage and in that time any deficiencies in the fortifications of threatened points could be supplied, so that when the Japanese were ready to strike they would encounter batteries against which their ships could hardly hope to stand.

He would therefore be reduced to the necessity of operating exclusively by blockade. He could seal the mouths of the Gulf of Finland and the Gulf of Riga and so bring Russian commerce in those waters to a standstill.

The New York Evening Post is authority for the statement that the rebellion in German South Africa has already cost 1,000 German lives and \$2,000,000 in money.
