The steamship Kilkeel is discharging a cargo of Inverness coal at Gen. E. Fullerton's coal yard.

James Smith, steward of the steamer Northumberland, came over by the Stanley yesterday.

Premier Peters received yesterday, from Lord Strathcona, his usual Christmas present of four fine peasants.

The Stanley arrived in port at 10.40 yesterday morning, with the following cargo:—One car sugar, two cars flour, one car iron plates, three cars way freight and seventeen passengers.
