The lobster fishermen have been busy preparing traps, etc., to entrap the lobster and all things indicate that spring has come even the east winds and icy fogs tell us of the P. E. Island spring.—Captain Jackson purchased the schooner Dart some time ago and she was the first vessel to arrive at Murray River Bridge this spring on the 17th.—Mr. F. Halzer went down the River a few days ago in his little vessel bound for some other port.—The larger part of the Murray Harbor vessels were in Sydney and Pictou last winter. Their captains and crews crossed to Pictou some time ago and are daily expected home but have not arrived yet.—At Murray River Bridge Mr. J. D. Hume, merchant tailor, is putting a large addition to his house. Mr. A. Moss, druggist, is enlarging his sample room.—Mr. R. Keenan postmaster is making several changes about his premises all of which when finished will improve the appearance of the south-side of the bridge very much.—In the Gladstone District, Mr. J. S.
