Confesses To Hold-Up Plan

WINDSOR, Ont., Feb 27—Sever in Laforest, twenty-four years old, teller at the Tecumseh branch of La Banque Provinciale, has confessed, according to the Windsor police, to planning the hold-up of Herbert Jacobs, postmaster at Tecumseh, who was robbed a week ago of a mail pouch containing, it is believed, more than \$6,000. Laforest who was arrested by Chief Constable of Tecumseh, signed a written statement, the police said, implicating five other men, three of whom are held here. Admitting that he used money of the bank from time to time until his shortage amounted to \$2,000, Laforest is said to have told Chief Constable Thompson, of Windsor, that the robbery of the mail pouch was suggested to him by one of the trio now held by the police. Instead of slightly more than \$6,000 being in the pouch when Postmaster Jacobs was held up by two armed men Laforest told Chief Thompson there was only \$4,000, although he signed vouchers saying he had turned over more than \$6,000 to the post office officials.

By this method, he is said to have the car in which the bandits escaped, the police say. Prosper, who cover up his shortage at the bank, was also arrested, has confessed to the money taken from the mail pouches.
