POLITICAL LEADERS IN THE IRISH CAPITAL

LONDON, May 27—Walter Hume Long, Secretary for the Colonies and who is chairman of the committee drafting the Irish Home Rule Bill, arrived last night in Dublin, according to a Press Association despatch from the Irish capital.

Several more arrests have been made in the country districts. Two of the men arrested Sunday, Comins and Mullins, will be court-martialed on charges of having illegal possession of explosives.

DUBLIN, May 24—Gossip in political circles here has been stimulated by the arrival of Herbert L. Samuel, former Home Secretary and one of the chief supporters of former Premier Asquith. He has conferred with a number of prominent Irish Liberals.

MUMMIFIED SNAKE IN LOG

Reptile Hermetically Sealed in Heart of Walnut Timber Discovered at Sawmill.

Trapped in a chamber in the heart of a walnut tree, which had evidently been its winter home, a blacksnake was found mummified in the hermetically sealed tomb after a lapse of 20 or more years. The layers of new timber formation indicated the period of the reptile's imprisonment.

A handsome walrus log two and one half feet in diameter, shipped to a mill at Johnson City, Tenn., from Waverlyville, N. C., held the imprisoned coil of the dead snake. To the eye the log was perfect. After the carriage had passed back and forth a time or two the saw uncapped a beautifully polished vacuum, with a dark coil lying within. Lifted out, the coil proved to be the preserved form of a snake. Exposure to air caused a sudden shrinkage.

WHAT HUNS OBTAINED FROM ROUMANIA

LONDON, May 27—Economic advantages which Germany obtained in the peace treaty with Roumania are equivalent to an indemnity from that nation in the opinion of the German experts, Dr. Von Kuehlmann, the German Foreign Secretary, told the Berlin Chamber of Commerce in his recent speech in which he discussed the Roumanian treaty before that body, the German wireless report of the address shows.

Germany's control of the coming harvests caused the food question to be looked forward to with a certain amount of confidence. Dr. Von Kuehlmann declared. German trade privileges also were most important, and these included the lease to a German company for 99 years of the Bucharest-Czernavodes-Constanza Railway line, thus giving ready access to the petroleum fields and grain centres.

Referring to the geographical situation, which eliminated the question of territorial acquisitions, Dr. Von Kuehlmann said that therefore, it was all the more necessary to obtain economical advantages up to a limit consistent with the maintenance of Roumania's capacity for production.

"Two points," he indicated, "must be taken into consideration, first guaranteeing Roumanian agricultural and petroleum production as urgently necessary for the carrying on of the war by the Central Powers Roumania has to fill in providing a thoroughfare to the East, especially as she dominates the lower course of the Danube.

The Danube Committee.

"It is here," continued the Minister, "that there comes into effect the International Danube Committee, which only states on the banks of the Danube can be represented. Only if the states agree to it will the countries lying on the Black Sea be able to come into it. Therefore, it is especially important for the German seaboard traffic that we have been able to secure sites for dockyards."

"Along the Danube, the importance of the Roumanian railways must be considered, especially the Bucharest-Czernavoda-Constanza line, over which Germany must have control. It has been agreed with Bulgaria that this railway to Constanza, which is to be made a free port with grain silos and petroleum tanks, is to be leased to a German Company for ninety-nine years. The cable between Constantinople and Constanza played an important role before the war. This cable is to be developed to the utmost and secured from enemy control."

Alluding to the agreement by which Germany had secured the Roumanian harvests of 1918-19, and the far-reaching option upon the entire Roumanian harvest for the next seven years, Dr. Von Kuehlmann said:

For German Trade.

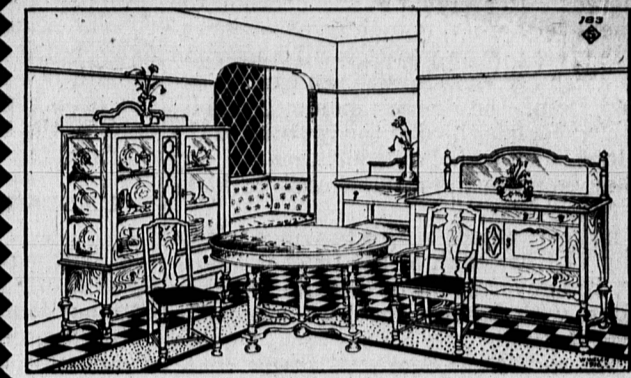
"One can look forward to the whole food question with a certain amount of confidence. Formal war indemnities were not demanded by Germany, but the numerous privileges we secured are equivalent, in the opinion of experts, to anything which would have been yielded by indemnities. When, some day, the damage caused by the U-boat warfare shall have been made good by newly-built ships, the sea route from Constanza, will regain its importance. Whether traffic on the Danube will be able to compete with it, is a question of the distant future. For the present, we shall have to rely on the Danube."

"It would be a mistake, however, to turn out eyes only to the East. There are the mouths of the Rhine and Elbe. Future policy will have to see to it that German trade strives with redoubled daring and energy to travel once more on the open sea. The day will come when the genius of our leaders and the incomparable courage of our army and navy shall have obtained victory and peace for us—a day when ships will again sail the ocean under the Black, White and Red flag. On that day the German merchant and the German shipowner will prove to the world that they have no equals; that severe trials have only made them the better qualified to take up competition again, and will prove that the proud motto, Nulli Secundus, is appropriate to them."

In the course of his remarks the Foreign Minister announced that the extraction of Roumanian petroleum had now been so far restored that the output was two-thirds the peace-time production.
