 Twenty-five candidates received the Encampment degree.
 The Grand Patriarch, in his report, after a few words of greeting reviewed the condition of the order.
 Oldfellowship is progressing, he said, in the Maritime Provinces both in members and in the interest taken in the order.
 The statistical report of the Grand Scribe showed that there are in the jurisdiction 16 Encampments with a membership of 621, an increase in members of 23 since last year.
 The sum of \$143.50 was paid for relief of Patriarchs and burial of dead.
 The grand total receipts of Subordinates was \$1376.28.
 Current expenses were \$712.00.
 The amount invested by Subordinates was \$2016.49.
