PARIS LIT WITH CANDLES

(By Dominion News Service.)
PARIS, Feb. 10.—The whole of the centre of Paris was suddenly plunged in darkness recently at six in the evening, through the total failure of the electric light, in consequence of a breakdown at the central generating station. The accident could not have happened at a worse moment, for it was exactly the time when pedestrian and vehicular traffic was most intense, owing to the closing of the great departmental stores, under the Eight-Hours law and the arrival of

Provincial Bank Position Strong

LIQUID ASSETS EQUAL TO 59 P. C. OF LIABILITIES TO PUBLIC

The annual meeting of the Provincial Bank of Canada was held in Montreal and the financial statement as on the 30th of November, last, was presented to shareholders. The statement which was reviewed shows an increase of \$3,769,000 in deposits. The total obligation due to the public, deposits, etc., are \$32,797,158, while the liquid assets, amounting to \$19,389,662 are 59 per cent. of the liabilities to the public. The net profits for the seventeen months' operations after provisions for all bad and doubtful debts, were \$583,696, which is at the rate of 13.73 per cent. on the paid up capital. The rest account stands at \$1,500,000, or 50 per cent. of the paid up capital. The bank assets now reach the sum of \$37,374,555 and its loans to cities, municipalities and school districts stand at \$1,720,655, while other current loans and discounts in Canada reach the figures of \$14,357,566, after a rebate on same for unmaturing notes of the sum of \$88,045. The Provincial Bank of Canada is the only Canadian bank having a board of control of five members elected among the shareholders, whose duties are each month to make an examination of the assets of the bank, making sure if the liquid assets are at least 50 per cent. of the savings deposits, as shown in the last monthly report submitted to the federal government—the directors of the bank, as per special regulations of the shareholders, are not authorized to borrow from the bank.

Orange Marmalade.—From four oranges and two lemons peel off the skins in quarters close to pulp and set aside. Break up pulp and remove seeds; add 1 cup water and simmer in covered saucepan 45 minutes. Meanwhile boil orange and lemon rinds with cups water in covered saucepan 30 minutes. Drain off and discard water. With sharp-edged scraper cut and discard all white part of orange and lemon skins right down to yellow rind. Then with a very sharp knife shred yellow rinds just as thin as possible in shreds about 1 inch long. Mix shredded rinds with cooked pulp. Measure level cups of this mixture into large saucepan, adding, if necessary, enough water to the fourth cup to make it level full. Add 7/8 leveled cups (3/4 lb.) sugar and mix well. Stir mixture hard and constantly and bring to a vigorous boil over the hottest fire. Boil hard 3 minutes with continual stirring. Remove fire and add 1/2 bottle (containing 1/2 cup) Certo, stirring it in well. Then let stand 5 minutes only, by the clock, with occasional stirring to cool slightly and pour quickly.

Grape Jelly.—Made in 10 minutes from bottled grape juice. Measure 4 leveled cups 7/8 leveled cups sugar into large saucepan, stir and bring to a boil.
