Mr. Boyver is to be congratulated upon his fine crop of excellent fruit. Some specimens of the Jessie variety, a very luscious berry, measure seven inches in circumference.

YARMOUTH will hold a firemen's tournament as a part of the celebration of the King's Coronation on August 9th at which liberal prizes will be given the successful competitors for decorated apparatus and athletic sports. A prize of \$75 is offered in the 300 yard hose reel race. Chief Hermans is in receipt of an invitation from the committee to himself and the men of the Charlottetown Fire Brigade, which it is learned they will be unable to accept as they are to take part in the procession and fireworks here on the evening of the same date.

A BAD runaway accident happened at North Tryon on Sunday, the 27th inst. A horse owned by Alex. Wood became uncontrollable at the Presbyterian Church and got away from its owner. In running around the church two young ladies were violently thrown from the buggy. Fortunately no injuries of a serious kind were found except a bad shaking up. The horse continued his wayward course until caught by some athletic young gentlemen at the gate, with only part of a wagon attached to him the rest having been demolished while on the circuit through the yard.

The engineers when they saw the carger jumped, one of the firemen, however, was in the act of shovelling coal and before he had time to change his mind he was hurled head first into the coal tender and the coal piled in upon him. When he extricated himself the engines were off the track and badly broken up. The track was cleared last night. Passengers on the train were considerably shaken up but prompt transfers were made.
