## KICKED BY VICIOUS HORSE.

### Little Walter Prowse of Upton Was Severely Injured.

Upton, May 31.—George Prowse, the 9-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Cornelius Prowse, who reside on the road to Westboro, about four miles from Upton Center, was very severely trampled upon late yesterday afternoon by one of the large horses used by the Prowses on their farm.

The little fellow when found was lying on the floor of the horse stall with one of the horse's forward feet resting squarely on his breast. The youngster was in a half-dazed condition. The boy's father attracted to the barn by the cries of his son, arrived just in time to see the little fellow dealt a powerful blow on body from one of the horse's feet. As quickly as possible the youngster was taken, bruised and bleeding, from his perilous position and a

physician was called. The little fellow's left leg was found to have been broken just below the knee; his body, head and arms showed plainly the work of the animal in kicking the boy around the stall, and Dr. Edward C. Traver, who was called, says it is a miracle he was not killed outright. Several bad cuts were made on the boy's body, and the bruises he received show that several very forcible kicks must have been made by the animal. No indication showed itself to the doctor that the youngster was injured internally.

This morning the boy was resting comfortably, and no fatal results are expected. He is a bright little chap and very popular with his playmates.

## KRUGER AS A MILLIONAIRE

### He is Said to Be Worth Twenty Millions of Money Sterling.

A South African paper says: "President Kruger's real estate places him in the front ranks of Transvaal capitalists. He owns 190 freehold farms in the Transvaal, many of them on the Main Reef, which he would not allow to be worked. He is a large owner of town lands in and around Pretoria; also Johannesburg. He is the largest landowner in Rustenburg district. In the Netherlands railway, Dynamite and Hatherley distillery, President Kruger is the largest shareholder, although his name does not appear. Mr. Kruger owns a large and valuable estate in Cape Colony; also one in Holland and one in Germany. He has two millions sterling invested in

German Consols. He has many minor interests and stocks in the Transvaal and Free State, which before the war amounted to no inconsiderable sum. Before the war of rebellion broke out, Paul Kruger's real estate was known by his own household to be worth between nineteen and twenty millions sterling. The war is a capitalists' war—so we are told every day—but Mr. Kruger is the chief capitalist who caused it, and he stands a good chance of being a very heavy sufferer. History is silent about Mr. Kruger's charity." Everyone knows that Mr. Kruger has managed to feather his own nest very well, but this estimate of his fortune is doubtless greatly exaggerated.
