SMALL VS. LARGE NAMES.

While it would scarcely be correct to say that agriculture is the exclusive business in Prince Edward Island, it is quite safe to say that it is the one business upon which all others depend, that without it there could be no other business. In the interests of every other calling, then, as well as in the interests of the farmers themselves, it is important that this calling be fostered to its utmost limit, to its ultimate capacity.

But, says one who owns and successfully operates a large farm, must I cut up my farm into five acre strawberry beds, sell all my horses and cattle, my modern machinery, to make room for twenty or thirty immigrants? By no means. We have no hope that the successfully operated farms will be cut up and the land divided up among strangers. Many of these farmers are giving employment to a reasonable number of men and women and are probably producing as much profit as if divided into smaller farms. But there are many farms, large and small, which, because of a misguided adherence to old methods, are being worked at a loss and the sons and daughters who should be employed upon them forced to go elsewhere to earn a living.

Prince Edward Island. In our government offices we understand that the salaries paid, with some few exceptions, are practically the same as were paid thirty years ago. As a result any good man who accepts a government position is at any time liable to be "called up higher" in his own province or elsewhere, of which the past few years furnish some notable examples. The legitimate inference is that either the government must pay its officials reasonable salaries or put up with officials who are worth only what they receive.

They are still going and we are still deploring the exodus. If the exodus is going to be stopped there must be a more reasonable distribution of profits between employer and employee. The employer must not attempt to gobble it all up, otherwise labor, in all its branches, will continue to leave us.

NEW DIRECTOR FOR ROYAL BANK OF CANADA.

MONTREAL, Sept. 12.—The directors of the Royal Bank of Canada have been added to by four additional members. Under the agreement by which the Royal Bank purchased the Trader's the latter institution was entitled to three representatives from its board, and Mr. Dymont has been added in recognition of his services in putting through the amalgamation.

The Ontario members of the Royal bank board are as follows:—E. F. B. Johnson, K. C., of Toronto; W. J. Sheppard, of Waubesa, C. S. Wilcox, of Hamilton, president of the steel company of Canada, and Albert E. Dymont, of Toronto. The Ontario section of the board will meet in Toronto, and will deal with all matters pertaining to the Ontario business of the bank. Mr. Johnson will practically be under the same management as it was previous to the amalgamation.

E. F. B. Johnson, was also elected second vice-president of the bank, and will thus become chairman of the Ontario section of the board. E. L. Pease, the general manager, remains first vice-president and Stuart Strath, becomes supervisor for Ontario, with his office in Toronto. He will have charge as formerly, of the general business for this province, and, as there are now 112 branches of the bank in Ontario alone, the duties of the former directors and general manager of the Trader's will be considerably increased.
