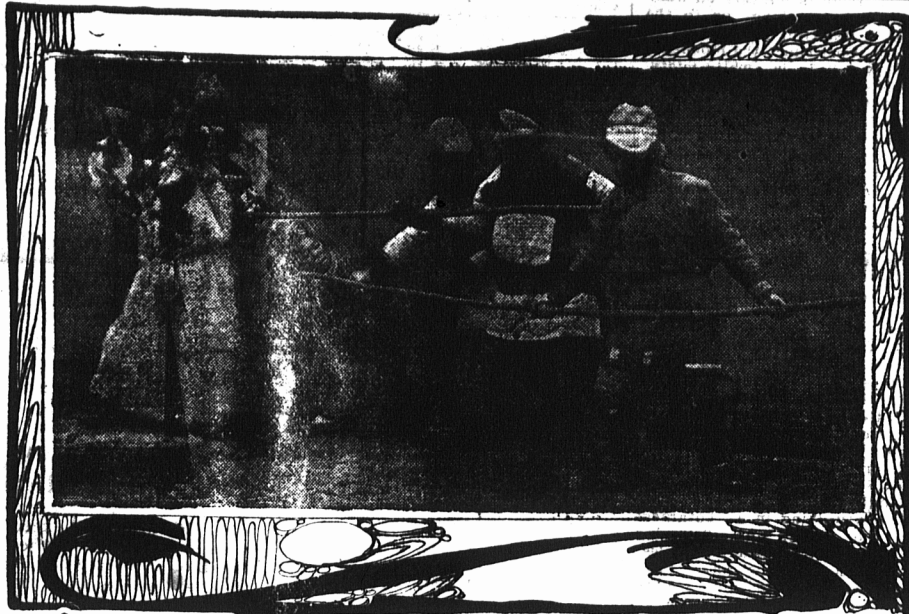
DR A C COGSWELL

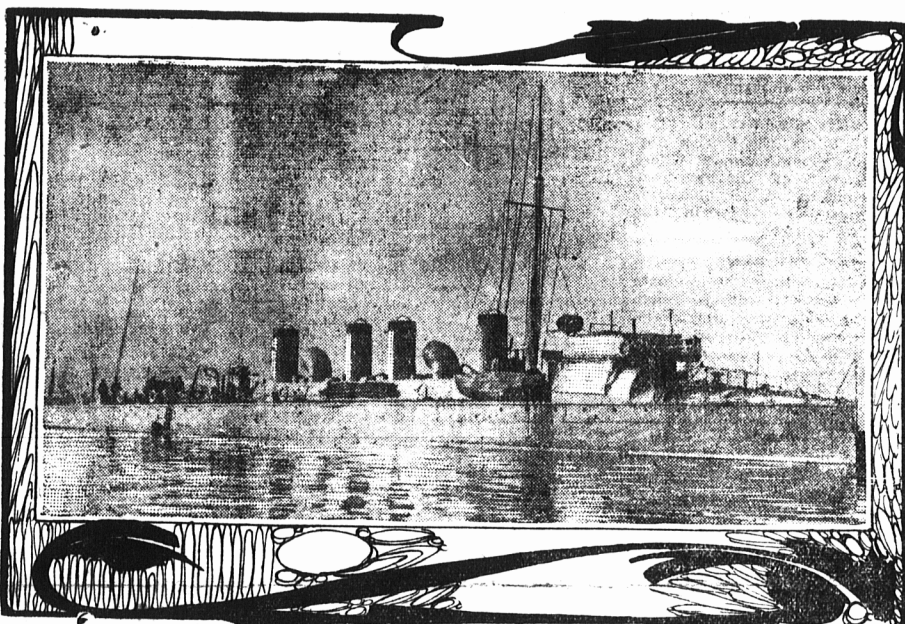

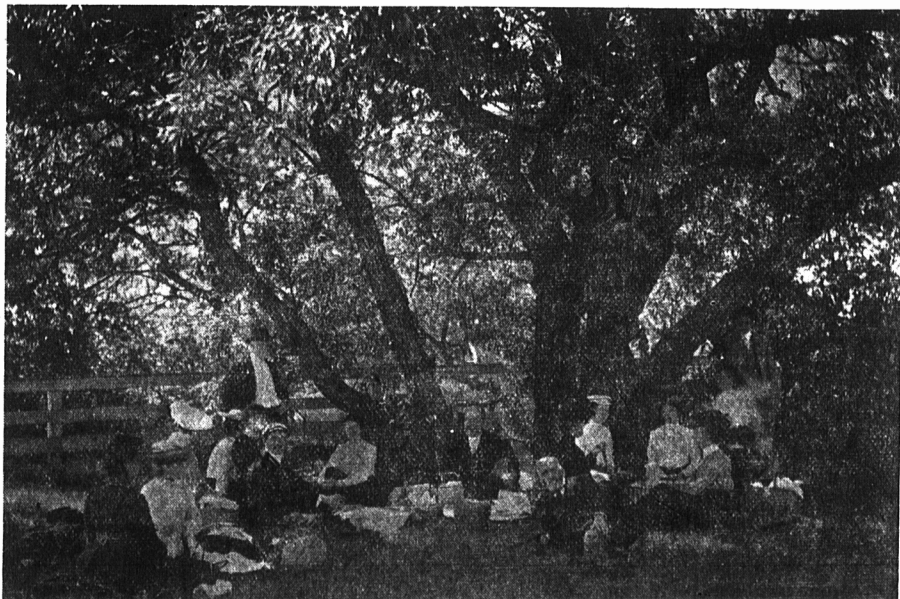


KOREAN SOLDIERS DANCING WITH STRAY MUMMIES.
