(From the 'Lady's Realm.') NAW YORK, Aug. 10. -- Many of our commonest dreams are occasioned by bodily condition of the surroundings. COCKNEYISM.

LONDON, Aug. 8.—Dr. Skeat, prominent concerning the campaign for the reform of the Cockney dialect, Professor Skeat's lifework has been the study of words—their sound, spelling, meaning and history—and he is one of the foremost philologists of the world.
