

**GREEK KILLED ON C. P. R. CROSSING.**

MONTREAL, Nov. 3—George Galendis, a Greek laborer, thirty-five years of age, unmarried, and living at 84 St. Charles Borromeo street, was killed this morning by a train at the C. P. R. crossing at Delorimier Park. The fatality was witnessed by George McCales, who was walking with Galendis, and who came in with the body on the train which the victim had tried to cross. An ambulance from Notre Dame Hospital was in readiness at the Place Verger station, but as Galendis was already dead the body was taken to the morgue where an inquest will be held to-morrow morning.
