The City Council will meet this afternoon at 4 o'clock.

There was a very small attendance at the market yesterday.

The first dust of the season was flying on the streets yesterday.

Rev. G. R. White and Rev. W. W. Lodge exchange pulpits at tomorrow morning's service.

It is probable that the Budget speech will be delivered in the Legislature on Tuesday or Wednesday.

A large number of the members of the Provincial Legislature returned to their homes yesterday afternoon.

W. G. Jones, formerly in the Bank of Nova Scotia in Charlottetown, has been appointed manager of the branch in North Sydney.

The ship was running from dock to dock on the Southport ferry yesterday and the boats will be placed in position in a few days.

Conductor George Tanton left last night for Moncton where he will attend a meeting of the O. R. C. Lodge which is to be held next week.

The Stanley made a good crossing yesterday to Georgetown and the mails reached the City at 1.05. A special took the mails to Georgetown last night at 9 o'clock.

Tax cargo by the Stanley yesterday to Georgetown included 500 packages way freight, and 12 horses for Willard Kitchen. There were also 90 bags mail and 30 passengers.

The vocalist at Rev. Mr. McConnell's lecture was Will Collins. His songs were His Majesty the King and Soldiers of the King, choir and audience joining in the choruses.

The Knights of Columbus held a very enjoyable social gathering at their rooms K. O. P. Hall last night. There were present a large number of the members' wives and lady friends.

Dr. Grant of Trinidad, moderator of the synod of the maritime provinces, was unanimously nominated at the last meeting of Sydney Presbytery as moderator of the forthcoming general assembly.

A GENTLEMAN drove by wagon to the city yesterday from China Point. He reports the roads fairly passable for wheels excepting between Tea Hill and Southport, where there is still considerable snow.

There was a large and enthusiastic meeting of the Citizens, Temperance Committee last evening in the Y. M. C. A. The meeting was a unit in condemning any attempt to repeal the Provincial Prohibitory Law.

Among the passengers by the Minto to Pictou yesterday morning were Mrs. David Rogers, Summerside, to Halifax where she will visit her cousin, Mrs. Milne Fraser; Miss Lottie Stumbles en route to Quincy, Mass., to enter upon her duties on the nursing staff of the city hospital there; Miss Jane Vickerson late of P. Perkins & Co's, for Pictou; Rev. J. M. McConnell on return to Moncton; J. M. Wiley to Halifax; S. K. and Mrs. Bell who have been visiting in Summerside and Alberton on return to St. John's, Nfld.; John Rattenbury on a visit to Halifax; Miss W. Innie Perkins on a visit to Pictou; J. A. Matheson, Fishery Inspector, and Capt. Taylor of the Gunter to Pictou.

A CURIOSITY on the streets yesterday was a vehicle adapted both to the snow and the bare streets. It was originally intended for a sleigh but attached to the runners were small wheels which could be lowered when the snow was passed. The contrivance attracted much attention.

DURING the past year the tide of immigration has not been altogether from this province to the United States and the West but some of our young men have returned and taken up homes in our own Island after spending years abroad. Among them are Charles McEachern of Hunter River who has returned from the United States and purchased the homestead of James Shaw, Brackley Point for \$3500. Albert Yeo of Kingston has also recently come back from the Klondyke and he has purchased the farm of William Howard, Kingston for a neat sum.

REPLYING to Mr. Lafuray in the House of Commons Hon. Mr. Emmerson said that Willard Kitchen was the lowest tenderer for the work of straightening the railway at Curtis Creek and had got the contract. The estimated cost of the first eleven miles of the Murray Harbor Branch of the P. E. I. Railway from Southport east was \$45,028 a mile. Mr. McManus was the tenderer for the work, but on account of ill health, not being able to look after it, he asked to be relieved. This was done, and the contract was given to the next lowest tender.

### EASTERN SHIPPING FACILITIES.

Sir.—One of the beatitudes reads "Blessed are the meek for they shall possess the land;" but shipping facilities when overlooked by nature are only given to those who persistently seek them. Of the total amount appropriated for this purpose—\$51,000, a most sum by the way—\$5,000 to be expended in the Charlottetown Dominion building improvements etc. is to be set aside leaving little enough no doubt for Queens and P. Inc. counties, but one is tempted to ask where does King's come in. It goes without saying that the interests of the eastern section of our beautiful province are neglected. In those days of improved dredges much might be done at a moderate outlay. Again even a train way for the transportation of freight would bring the produce of the North Shore farmer in touch with shipping facilities at Souris or Harmony, as rounding East Point in the late autumn is at best a hazardous undertaking. The situation reminds me of a lad who in trying on a pair of boots asking his father what he thought of them and was told to speak for himself as he had them on his own feet. The people of King's county should get together, find out their most urgent needs in this respect, approximate estimate of their cost and I am sure that in this simple matter of justice and fair play they would have the co-operation of both voters and representatives in every section regardless of party with an aided kind word from their paper, The Guardian.
