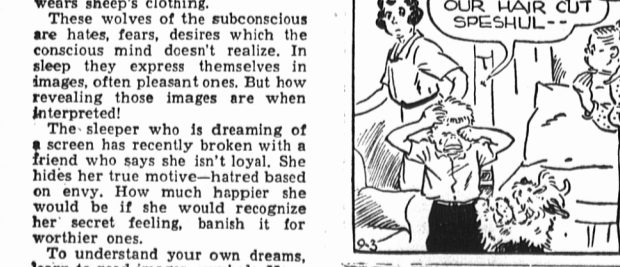

In the last number of Consumer's News it was stated that all mirrors offered for sale must carry a label stating whether they are made of plate or window glass. Does this regulation refer to mirrors already in the retail stores? A. No. It refers to all mirrors manufactured after June 5th, 1942. Unlabelled mirrors in the retail stores will all be old stock supplied before that date.

Q. Why is it that the Red Cross is the only organization to be allowed extra sugar for war activities? A. The Red Cross is allowed sugar only for the purpose of sending parcels to war victims and prisoners already in the retail stores. No extra sugar is allowed to any organization for the purpose of raising money for war charities. Organizations which operate canteens for the fighting forces can with the written authorization of the C.M.A. obtain sugar for any canteen or mess situated within the limits of naval, military, or air force camps, barracks, dockyards or similar establishments.

Q. Is a person liable to charges of hoarding on unrationed commodities? A. Yes. It is illegal for a consumer to stock up on quantities of any goods, beyond an amount reasonably required for the use of the household.
