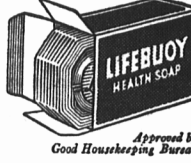

THE COOK'S CORNER

Potato Soup 2 cups mashed potatoes 2 slices onion 1 teaspoon chopped parsley 1 quart milk 1 teaspoon flour 2 teaspoons butter Salt and pepper Scald milk with onion. Remove onion. Add milk slowly to potatoes...

Potato and Cheese Puff 2 cups hot mashed potatoes 2 eggs yolks 2-3 cup grated cheese 1-2 teaspoon salt 1-8 teaspoon pepper 1 cup milk 3 egg whites Beat yolks and blend with the potatoes, seasonings, milk and cup cheese...

Potatoes O'Brien Dive cold boiled potatoes. Mix with chopped raw bacon, onion, and pimento. Fry in fat in a frying pan as for hashed brown potatoes.

Pittsburg Potatoes These are really hashed brown potatoes with a little green pepper added. Cut cold boiled potatoes in small pieces and cook in a thin white sauce until the sauce is thick...

Spanish Potatoes Cut cold boiled potatoes in small pieces and cook in a thin white sauce until the sauce is thick, taking care not to let the potatoes burn. When ready to serve, sprinkle with paprika until the potatoes are a deep pink. Serve hot.

French Fried Pare potatoes. Cut lengthwise into 8 or 10 pieces. Lay on a towel to absorb the moisture. Fry in deep fat. Drain on crumpled unglazed paper. Sprinkle with salt and serve.
