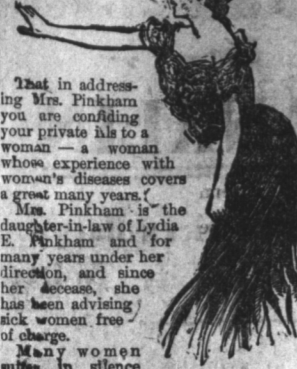

Synopsis of Canadian North-West Homestead Regulations.

ANY person desiring to obtain Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta, excepting 5 and 20 acre lots, must be homesteaded by any person who is the head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, or the holder of one-quarter section of 60 acres more or less.
