THE DANGER FROM SMALL POX.

A Georgetown correspondent expresses the fear that adequate preparations have not been made to repel a probable invasion of smallpox during the coming winter, and especially in regard to protecting our winter ports of entry. We regard the matter as a very vital one. There is every indication from the number of centres already infected that smallpox will be very widely prevalent in Canada during the coming cold season. And there are so many ways by which he infection may be spread and may reach us even from distant points, that it becomes the health authorities to be on the alert and take all possible precautions without delay.

The disease may be transmitted from place to place by persons coming hither who, with or without knowing the fact may have been exposed to infection; it may come in a bale of merchandise, in clothing, baggage or even in the mails. By one or other of all these agencies a channel of communication between the Island and places where smallpox exists in Canada or the United States is almost constantly kept up. We have for many years escaped, but the immunity we have enjoyed in the past can give us no security for even a week in the future. Precautions of a strict character are necessary to prevent the disease being brought to our shores, to care for and isolate any cases that may break out suddenly, and to make provision in Charlottetown for a contagious diseases hospital where a number of patients can be cared for at once, should the dread emergency arise.

That our citizens are entitled to every protection which the guardians of the public health can give them is a statement too obvious to need any argument in its support. Further than this, they are entitled to know what is being done, and that all due care and precautions are being observed. This is necessary, in order that the public may be secure and may have good grounds to feel secure. This assurance we do not have at the present time. For instance, what is being done to provide the proposed hospital? This matter must not be permitted to end in talk. What measures are being taken to prevent smallpox being imported and disseminated in this Province? We know of none. It is impossible that we can feel secure under these conditions. We are in fact without security. Our health authorities have need to wake up and show that they are on guard and active. It would be nothing less than a crime to permit the disease to obtain a lodgement in the Island and find us unprepared, when by proper precautions the invasion might be prevented.

On enquiry at the post office THE GUARDIAN learns that on Friday 18th the night train to Tignish was cancelled at Summerside and no postal car went West until the night of the 19th. The mail of the 18th was made up at Charlottetown for the Mail Clerk West and as no train went West the matter was delayed.
