**Stock Markets At A Glance**

**WINNIPEG, May 1 — (CP) —** Rye futures gave a strong display in an active trading session on the Winnipeg grain exchange today which saw many climb to an all-time high of 2.93 bid.

**CHICAGO, May 1 — (AP) —** May rye advanced on short covering in a relatively quiet trade today. Although the number of transactions was small, price changes were fairly broad in view of the "thin" market existing in this future. Oats finished late in the session in sympathy with the rye strength after selling off on moisture reports in early dealings.

**MONTREAL, May 1 — (CP) —** Utilities went to a new all-time high in the indices in trading today on the stock exchange and curb market. Generally, however, increases and losses were almost paired while a large quota of issues failed to move. Volume in junior mines continued to dwindle.

**NEW YORK, May 1 — (AP) —** Stocks moved irregularly lower today in the quietest market in a month although selected issues responded to favorable earnings or dividend news.

The Dow Jones industrial average closed at 166.66, a point and 1/2 below the previous day's close.

Canadian stocks were off at the close except for Distillers, Seagram which gained 1-1/2. Both Canadian Pacific and Dome slipped 1-4. McIntyre was down 3-8 and Hiram Walker lost 2-3-8.

**TORONTO, May 1 — (CP) —** Apart from weakness in the gold group, the Toronto stock market maintained an even keel today. The golds lost 1-37 in the index and the base metal and western wild rubbers were down only 1/2 and 1/4.

Denison trade in volume of 998,000 shares on the news that plans were on foot to start soon on the production of ore. Starting on Monday at 8 cents, the stock today finished 25 cents and closed at 23 for a net gain today of 10 cents.

**NOTICE**

**HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ACT**

Commencing Wednesday, May 1, 1946, traffic on the CHARLOTTETOWN - BORDEN, CHARLOTTETOWN - TIGNISH, and CHARLOTTETOWN - RUSTICO paved highways will be open to motor vehicles with gross weight (vehicle and load) not in excess of 10,000 lbs.; also traffic on the CHARLOTTETOWN - SOURIS and CHARLOTTETOWN - MONTAGUE paved highways will be open to motor vehicles with gross weight (vehicle and load) not in excess of 12,000 lbs., provided that in no case shall any vehicle, whose gross weight, including load, exceeds 5,000 lbs. proceed at a speed greater than twenty miles per hour.

Anyone driving on provincial highways contrary to this order shall be duly prosecuted.
