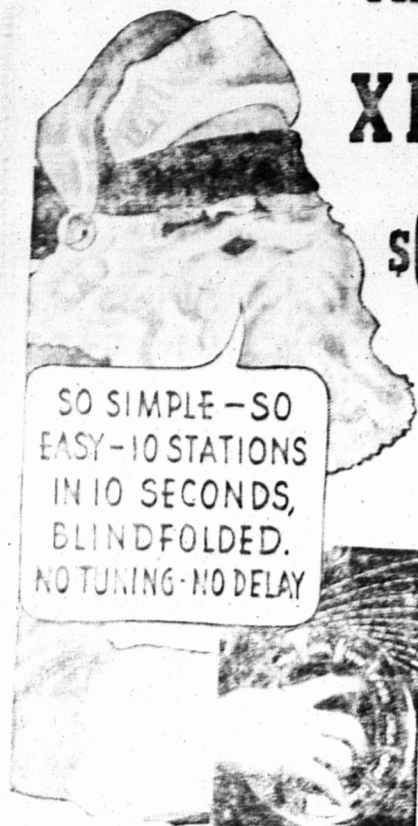

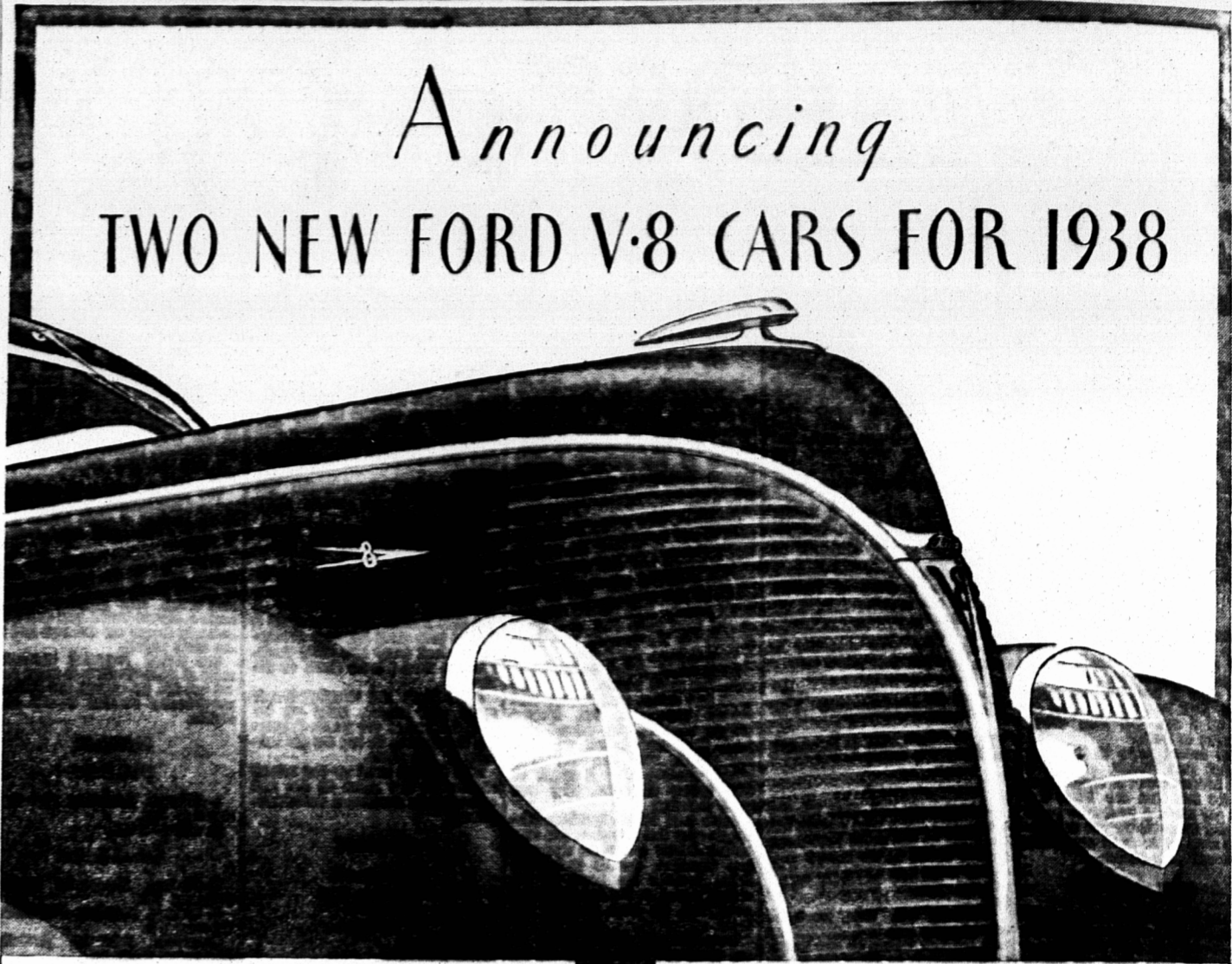
Student Strike At Kalamazoo Ends

(A. P. by Guardian's Special Wire) KALAMAZOO, Mich., Dec. 15.—The student strike at Kalamazoo College ended tonight after preventing classes for two days. The 350 students accepted a temporary agreement concerning the future of Dr. Carey K. Gansong, popular economics professor from James N. B. over whose dismissal the walkout started. Dr. Stewart Grand Coue, Canadian-born president of the college, said he was withdrawing the dismissal notice given Dr. Gansong and that his future relationship with the college shall be decided by the Board of Trustees during the coming two weeks after the consideration of the matter with the Student Senate and the President of the college. Dr. Gansong urged the strikers at a mass meeting to accept the agreement.

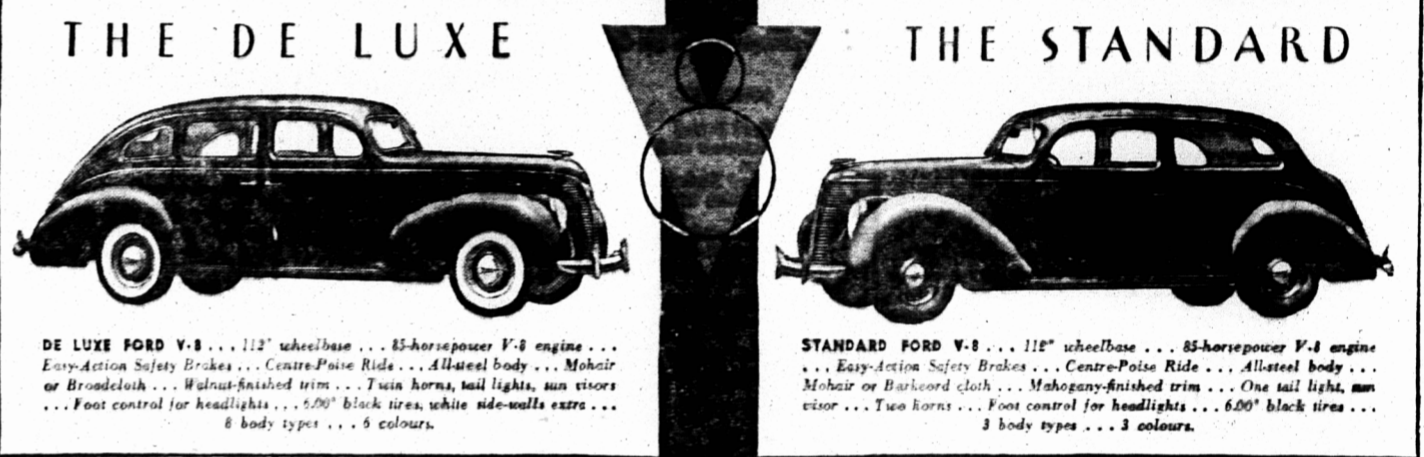

Insurgents Mass Troops Near Madrid

(By The Associated Press) HENDAYE, Franco-Spanish Frontier, Dec. 15.—Spanish Government artillerymen today shelled insurgent positions near Madrid where scouting planes reported General Franco was massing troops. They kept up a steady fire on points within a short radius of

the city, including Vozuelo de Alarcón and Aravaca to the north-west, Carananchel to the south-west, and Villaverde to the south. The Insurgents, who maintained secret military operations after closing all frontiers of the territory they held, reported all sectors were quiet. An order by General Franco to close the Portuguese border, dispatches from western Insurgent Spain said, completed the frontier blockade.

DEVONPORT, Australia, Dec. 14.—While gardening at his Tasmanian home here after the Commonwealth elections in which his government was returned to power, Prime Minister J. A. Lyons had his foot pierced by a thorn from a cherry plum tree he had cut down. The trouble cleared rapidly, however, and Mr. Lyons flew to Melbourne to resume his duties at Canberra, the capital. He was limping badly from a swollen ankle on arriving at Melbourne.
