Shaw and was formerly Principal of the Fanning High School, and is to be congratulated in common with the three other honor men in the abundant success attained. About 149 men attempted the examination of whom 29 scored honors and 83 passed. The Medical Faculty will close a month earlier this year than usual to permit of alterations and enlargements in the Medical Building.

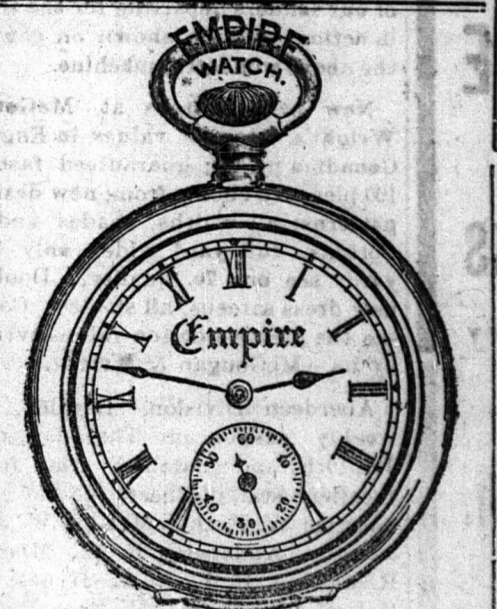
