Tell of Miracles At Lourdes

LONDON, August 15.—A first visit to Lourdes is moving beyond words. The town is beautiful, and if Our Lady of the Grotto had desired that even the setting of the story of her apparition to the little shepherd girl, Bernadette, should add its own touch of appeal she would perhaps have chosen no better.

But it is not the setting, not the story itself and certainly not its often tawdry presentation all over the town that stirs the depths of the soul. It is the unending procession of the sick and halt and blind, brought here from all points of the compass, desperately hoping for healing, and the great company of those who bring them, the great concourse of anguished souls and anguished bodies crying to Heaven in many tongues, as at a new Pentecost.

To the newly-arrived visitors writes H. W. Smith in the London Daily News it seems that the whole place is given over to the cult of the miracle. It is in continuous occupation of an army of suffering and of devotion. The townspeople join themselves to the processions for the sick. They tell you that there is no crime, and that unbelief is rare among them. They are prosperous. Since 1858, when the Beautiful Lady appeared to Bernadette, the sons of peasants who knew her as a shepherd girl have grown rich.

The hotels are crowded. The shops abound with pictures, images, and souvenirs. The trade in candles alone must be enormous; for the thousands of pilgrims who throng to the nightly procession all carry each his or her lighted candle to be raised towards Heaven as they join in the Ave Maria. The heart of Lourdes is the Grotto where little Bernadette Soubirous first saw her Lady, and it may be said that its strong pulse is the bathing pools adjacent.

Under the plane trees in the courtyard, meanwhile, the priests, surrounded by the waiting sick, invoke the help of Heaven and Our Lady of Lourdes. Very seldom surely does one hear Almighty God addressed in accents of such agonised application. It is a very wrestling with the Spirit of Heaven.

BEEF-STEAK PIE. Requires chuck steak, cut in narrow strips; bit of garlic, one-half bay-leaf, six peppercorns, sprig of parsley, one onion stuffed with two cloves, one cup sliced carrots, one cup celery cut in strips, four halved potatoes. The garlic, bay-leaf, peppercorns, parsley and onion should be tied in a square of cloth. Place steak in a kettle with boiling water to cover, and let it simmer for half an hour. Add seasoning in bag together with salt to the meat, and thicken the stock. Place the kettle on an asbestos mat to keep the sauce from sticking. Some dried mushrooms soaked and drained improve the flavor. Simmer while making the pastry. Then remove the bag of seasoning. Put all in a baking-dish with a rolled crust over the top and sides, well ripened fruit, and are in great demand.
