## THE OUTLOOK.

If we were to take the opinions of the opposed party leaders for our guidance as to the chances of the coming political contest we should be in the position of a jury with only contradictory evidence before them. Sir Charles Tupper has been telling in Montreal since his return thither from the East that the outlook for his party in the Maritime Provinces was never better. His first lieutenant, Hon. Hugh John Macdonald predicts that the Government cannot carry a single seat west of Ontario. That disposes of two thirds of the length of the Dominion. And as for the remaining third the Conservative leaders unite in claiming large gains in both Ontario and Quebec. If these claims could be made good at the polls the Liberal party would be swept away as it was in 1878.

But on the other side it must be admitted that the Liberal leaders are equally if not more confident. They say the Government is strong in its personnel, that it has given the country good and popular measures; that it has honestly and capably managed the affairs of the nation, has settled the Manitoba school question, brought in preferential trade with the Mother Country, responded to the popular demand in sending a little army to South Africa, has given the boon of cheap postage within the country and between Canada and Britain, has extended the Intercolonial to Montreal and wiped out the railway deficit, has completed the enlargement of the canals, opened up the Kootenay on terms that give reduced freight rates to all the North West, has opened up and organized the Yukon Territory and made the Yukon pay its way, has largely increased the inflow of immigration, has reduced the rate of customs taxation largely and yet has the largest revenue and the largest surplus in the history of the Dominion.

Such are the party claims, but in making our own estimate we must take some other things into account. It is in the Government's favor that times are generally good, that trade flourishes, that the manufacturing industries are busy and prosperous. It may be said truly that hard times and good times succeed each other in all countries and without regard to what party is in power, but none the less good times are a powerful assistant to a party in power, just as on the contrary hard times, and the popular discontent which accompanies hard times have frequently been a main cause of a Government's overthrow. As a partial offset to the advantage of good times the considerable failure of the harvest in Manitoba comes in, and also the advance in prices all over the world of many articles of universal consumption. It may also be observed that while the Government will get credit in the English-speaking Provinces for sending the Contingent to South Africa, there are sections in Quebec Province where this action will form the strongest factor in creating opposition to Ministers and their supporters.

The attitude of the Provincial Governments will form a considerable factor in determining the result at the polls. As matters now stand the Laurier Government has at its back the Provincial Governments of Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, P. E. Island, Quebec and Ontario. The Government of British Columbia stands equally divided between parties, while the Government of Manitoba will fight in the coming battle on the side of the Opposition. these local administrations are not particularly strong, but none the less they represent power and prestige which always count for something in an election. Thus we have a combination in which a strong and united central Governmental party is supported by Provincial Administrations holding control over nine-tenths of the population of the country.

The by-elections held since the general election of 1896 have been pretty widely distributed over the area of the Dominion and cover every year of the Laurier term of power. The fact that out of some five of these by-elections nearly nine-tenths have gone in favor of the party in power is more calculated to support the confidence of the Liberals than their opponents. It will hardly be claimed that this test is a decisive one, though it has been usual in Dominion affairs that general elections have followed the trend of the preceding by-elections. It was thus during Sir John Macdonald's long term of power, during which a large majority of the by-elections went in his favor. During the Mackenzie regime the by-elections went against the Liberal Government in a large majority of cases and were followed by the overwhelming defeat of that party in 1878.

An incident of the campaign so far as it has developed is the entry of two Provincial Premiers as candidates for the Commons. On the one side Hon. Hugh John Macdonald enters the field as a supporter of Sir Charles Tupper, and on the other side Hon. H. R. Emmerson of the more populous Province of New Brunswick becomes a candidate in support of Sir Wilfred Laurier. In this particular honor are easy. We need not now hazard a guess as to the result of the coming election. We have indicated some of the agencies and influences that will be factors in the contest and beyond that we leave our readers each for himself to form his own opinion.
