CURE FOR THAT TIRED FEELING

BERLIN, June 18—Prof. Loewy, of the Berlin Agricultural High School, a famous specialist, has arranged so that no body need ever be tired any more—has found how to inoculate us against that exhaustion of vital energy which we call getting fagged out. Perfectly serious he is about it. He has discovered that a substance called spermin injected under the skin removes the symptoms of exhaustion and enables weary creatures to go on working long after nature usually cries "Halt!"

Some trained dogs were set like prisoners to run everlastingly uphill over an electrically driven treadmill. They were kept at this mill until the poor beasts looked ready to drop with exhaustion and the chemical tests showed that the drain on what constitutes energy in dogs and men was too great to be longer maintained. Then the professor injected large doses of spermin under the dogs' hides.

In three experiments the immediate result was a great recovery from exhaustion and the dogs were set to work again on their treadmill and trotted off, if not as fresh as ever yet distinctly on longer overtired.

Why spermin produces this extraordinary effect Prof. Loewy has not yet ascertained.

BRITISH COUNSEL CONCLUDES ARGUMENT.

THE HAGUE, June 18.—Having talked uninterruptedly for eight days Sir Robert Finlay, Counsel for Great Britain last evening concluded his address on the Newfoundland fishery dispute between Great Britain and the United States.

He covered practically every point involved.

He contended among other things that the treaty of 1818 merely gave the American fishermen liberty to fish on common with English fishermen. He also maintained that American fishing boats could not employ persons who were not Americans.

EXPLOSION OF JEWISH CHILDREN.

ST. PETERSBURG, June 18.—The Senate, the highest court of appeal in Russia, to-day ordered that the explosion of Jewish children at Moscow be suspended, until a decision has been handed down interpreting the law with reference to children.

BIG NOVA SCOTIA RAILWAY PLANNED.

HALIFAX, N. S., June 18.—It looks as if the construction of the railway to the east of Halifax from Dartmouth to Guysboro, about 150 miles and from New Glasgow to Country Harbor, is within measurable distance. A company has been organized for the purpose and a charter is issued. It is understood that a contract will be signed in a few days. The charter under which the company acts has been published in the Royal Gazette, in conformity with the provincial law, which requires that this be done before the signing of any contract. The charter is granted to a company represented by John Bogert, Barrister, of Toronto, barrister; Thomas B. Fogg, of Toledo, Ohio, railway manager; George H. Raw, and Siegmund Hirsch, of London, England.

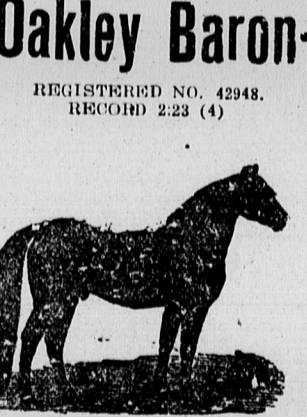
