SAINT JOHN MEN CAPTURE HALF MILE AT LAKE PLACID

LAKE PLACID, N. Y., Feb. 12. - Charles Gorman of Saint John, N. B., Canadian champion, led the field tonight at the close of the third day's racing in the International amateur outdoor speed skating championships. Gorman, with a total of 110 points, was well ahead of Valentine Bialis, of Lake Placid, defending champion, and O'Neill Farrell of Chicago, who were tied with 90 points each. Bialis was the star performer in today's events, winning the three-quarter mile and taking second in the half mile. Charles Jewtraw, former champion, skated an exhibition one-sixth mile in 25.35 seconds. The championship events will be finished tomorrow with 220 yards and five-mile races.

In the first race today, the three-quarter mile Gorman did not start his sprint soon enough after he had hung back through the whole course. Willie Logan failed to qualify for any event, qualified Ross Robinson, of Toronto, today in the half mile, but failed to place in the semi-final.
