P. E. I. Potatoes In N. Y. Racket

NEW YORK, April 15—An alleged "racket" by which the Government is said to have been defrauded of from \$250,000 to \$300,000 in customs dues on imported potatoes from Prince Edward Island was discovered today at the conclusion of a year's investigation by 25 special customs agents.

The evidence has been turned over to Federal Attorney George Z. Medalle by the agents, who intimidated that indictments would be asked against 16 or 20 potato dealers who would face charges on 32 counts some of which carry a penalty of two years in prison.

The agents said the "racket" consisted of importing the finest Prince Edward Island potatoes and storing them, duty free for trans-shipment, in bonded warehouses. Then instead of reshipping the imported potatoes, cheaper domestic potatoes are shipped in sacks bearing the port mark placed on the imported bags.
