Civic Reports

The following reports, each addressed to His Worship the Mayor and members of the City Council, were submitted at last night's annual meeting of the City Council:

RELIEF COMMITTEE

The Relief Department today is a unit of National Registration Branch, Department of Labor, Ottawa. Operating as outlined by their rules and regulations, with monthly returns and reports on all applicants in detail, and a monthly audit as to expenditures. Indications at this time promise a substantial reduction in Relief costs for the year 1941.

TENDER COMMITTEE

There were twelve separate tenders called during the year 1940, as follows—and were awarded to those named: One tender called for Pumping and Heating the City Works Building, was not awarded, the Council deciding not to proceed with this installation.

LIGHT COMMITTEE

There is not very much change in the Street Lighting system for the year 1940. Only one bid was in—1-100 c.p. at DeBrisley Crescent.

FIRE COMMITTEE

Your Committee met during the year with the Chief and talked over all complaints that the members of the department thought necessary to bring before the Council. We have recommended some changes in regard to the equipment which we think is necessary for furthering the safety of our citizens' property, particularly a pump, also the installation of a siren to replace the bells. We sincerely hope that the fire department for the year to come will be no worse than in the past year.

Police Report

The strength of the Force throughout the past year was maintained at eleven men, consisting of one Chief, three Sergeants and seven Constables. One Constable, George Richard Gregory, being appointed Constable, on probation, November 28th, to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Constable R. O. McLean, on December 1st.

Extensive replacements and reconstruction of worn out asphalt surfacing was carried out on the various streets of the City where it was required. The work was performed by day labour under the direction of the City Surveyor, and the total cost was \$8,253.89, comprising Labour \$5,175.91, and material \$3,077.98.

The New City Works building at the foot of Pownall street, which now contains the City's vehicles, stables, horses and stable, was constructed during 1940 under contract with Albert MacKinnon. The contract price was \$8,657.00.

The bed of Spring Park Street was cleaned out from the north end of the Brighton culvert to the Bluestone was added, as required, to the water of Government Pond, in order to keep it clean and free from the growth of algae and from objectionable odours.

From January 15, 1940 to Dec. 31, 1940, 30 building permits were issued, of which 17 were for trades and 13 were for buildings for other purposes. The total value of this construction was \$123,785.00 for the year. Two out of 6 these permits were for buildings in the fire zone; one was for a stucco service station, the other for a store and warehouse covered with fireproof asbestos shingles.
