MANY learned yesterday with great regret of the accident Monday night to Dr. Conroy of this city. The doctor, accompanied by A. N. Fraser, Insurance agent, was driving near Royalty Junction where he had made a professional call, when the sleigh upset throwing both out with considerable force and breaking Dr. Conroy's hip. Mr. Fraser succeeded in getting the doctor slowly back to the city and the injured man was treated by Drs. Jenkins, Kelly and Taylor. Last night he was doing as well as could be expected, and Mrs. Conroy, who has been also quite ill, was much improved.

It is with deep sympathy and regret that the many friends in Dundas, and vicinity have learned of the sad death of Herbert H. Hilly, at his former home Lunenburg Co., N. S., after an illness of several months which he contracted from a fall he received while at work on a building in Roxbury, Mass., some four years ago and never fully recovered. Mr. Hilly was thirty-nine years of age, a man of good Christian qualities and a member of the official board of the Eglington Square M. E. Church in Roxbury, and was an ardent worker. He proved to be the same during his stay of seven years at Upton, always taking a prominent part in churches, lodges and schools, and was many times a delegate from them to various places. His loss was felt keenly when he departed to make his abode in Roxbury with hopes of some day returning to be with us once more. Thinking he would regain health he went to his old home in N. S. four months ago, only to gradually sink away and expired on the 29th ult., in the presence of his wife, youngest son, and many friends. His wife, who patiently nursed him in his illness, has returned to Roxbury, Mass., to reside with her three children and our hearts go out in kind sympathy to her and all the bereaved. A sad and peculiar incident occurred at the same place, Sydney, a brother of Mr. Hilly, was taken ill with pneumonia on the 23rd, and died eight hours before he ceased. Both were interred at the same hour side by side.
