Decay Bodies Can Be Arrested

Process Discovered by Which Dead Bodies Can Be Preserved 20 Years

PARIS, Sept. 27.—The discovery of a process by which the dead body can be preserved for twenty years is announced by two Paris physicians, Professor Fellesenichy and Dr. Edmond Bertha. What it does, according to their statements, is to solidify the body so that actual flesh and blood assume the appearance and hardness of marble.

Before a small party of newspapermen the first public experiment was conducted last evening by Dr. Bertha, with every appearance of success. The body of an elderly woman who had died in a hospital was used. It was laid on an operating table as if for dissection and as death had taken place ten days ago, putrefaction had already begun. Dr. Bertha, before beginning his treatment, called attention to the marks of decay and said that one of the remarkable features of his process was that, even though decay had begun, it could be arrested and the body preserved as well as if death had just taken place. What his method was the doctor, of course, refused to disclose. All he did was to inject with a syringe into the femoral artery the conserving liquid which Professor Fellesenichy and he say they have discovered.

For a time there was no change in the appearance of the body, but at the end of about an hour the flesh began to take on an aspect as if life, the muscles filled out and the tissues and tendons became like those of a living person. In two hours the change was complete. The skin, too, had changed its appearance and, although almost dead white and waxy, was almost the same in tint as when the body had been alive. The features wore a different expression, as if repose, owing to the filling out of the muscles and flesh, and the whole body presented the appearance of a sleeping person or a finely chiseled statue. All traces of sickness and death had been removed.

Today the body has the same appearance and the next step in the process will be completed in a few days. The skin will then be treated with a preserving pomade and when this has been done the conserving liquid which has been injected into the body will, the doctor says, harden so that the body itself will become perfectly rigid and as hard as if frozen, but will retain the appearance it now has of tranquility and sleep.

No embalming process yet invented, either modern or ancient, the doctors assert, can so well preserve the natural expression and appearance of life, which they say will persist for at least twenty years.

Governor Coolidge, Republican vice presidential candidate, is a Congregationalist, and Franklin D. Roosevelt, his Democratic opponent, an Episcopalian—Philadelphia Public Ledger.

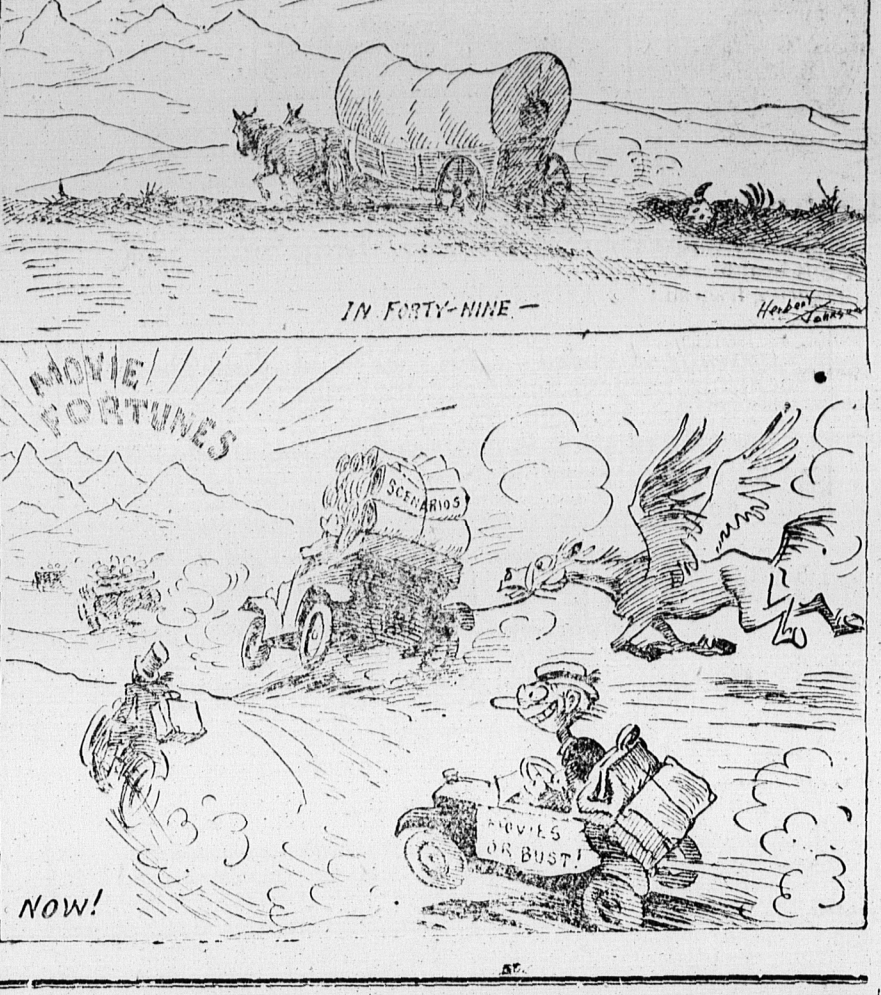
Notice to Oyster Fishermen
