Island Born Centenarian To Celebrate Birthday Tomorrow

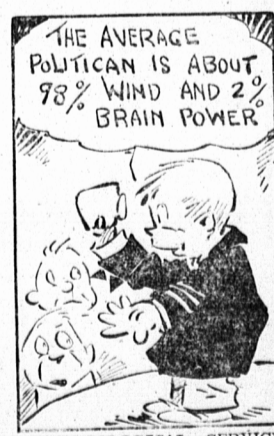
