LAST HOME OF OPEN SLAVERY. LONDON, N. Jan. 18.-That Abyssinia is the last home of open slavery; that in its capital, Addis Ababa, there are more slaves than free men, and the British legation there is full of slaves owned by legation servants, are assertions made by two correspondents of the Westminster Gazette who lately have been in Abyssinia. The correspondents assert that of the slaves alleged to be in the British legation many are British subjects, having been captured by slave raiders in British territory. The article declares that France, Great Britain and Italy, having bound themselves under the terms of the 1919 treaty to supply munitions to the Abyssinians, it is now only the United States which is reported to seek to import arms into Abyssinia, destined to assist the slave raiders. In an editorial on the article, the Westminster Gazette suggests that the British Foreign Office has preferred to say as little as possible about the alleged scandalous conditions and calls for the abandonment of the "cash policy" and for the full light of publicity to be thrown on them both in England and the United States.
